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

KEY VOTE: "NO" ON FY17 OMNIBUS SPENDING BILL (H.R. 244)

MAY 02, 2017

This week, the House and Senate will consider the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2017 (H.R. 244), a 1,665-page omnibus spending package that would fund the federal government through September 30, 2017. The Heritage Foundation explains that while the bill, which was released publicly at 2 AM Monday morning, "does make progress" on some issues, "it woefully fails the test of fiscal responsibility and does not advance important conservative policies."

Many conservatives went along with a short-term continuing resolution last December based on a promise that the current deadline would be used to advance key policy priorities. Instead, the bill is widely viewed as a rebuke to President Trump's agenda and conservative priorities.

Overall, the Trump administration requested an additional \$30 billion in military, \$1.5 billion to continue construction of the southern border wall, and \$18 billion in discretionary cuts. The bill provides only \$15 billion for defense (of which \$2.5 billion is withheld until the administration submits a plan to combat ISIS), provides no funding for the border wall, and actually increases domestic discretionary spending. Through a combination of emergency funding and overseas contingency operations funds, the bill pushes discretionary spending \$93 billion above the budget caps.

The Trump administration was rebuked at the program level as well. The Department of Energy's Office of Science will receive an additional \$42 million, whereas the administration requested a \$900 million reduction. Funding for Community Development Block Grants was kept level despite a \$1.5 billion requested reduction. The list goes on, as CQ Roll Call reported: "Trump proposed killing off more than a dozen federal programs in his fiscal 2018 budget outline, but it doesn't appear appropriators are inclined to reduce or eliminate federal funding for any of those line items."

Liberals celebrated the bill as a victory over President Trump and claimed they successfully blocked "more than 160 Republican poison pill riders." Heritage notes the omnibus "fails to advance almost any key conservative policies" as "it would continue to provide funding for Planned Parenthood and do nothing to restrict funding to sanctuary cities "

Along with a lack of conservative policy riders, the bill contains a \$1.3 billion bailout for the United Workers of America, a union that represents about 10 percent of all coal production in the U.S. today. Coal miners deserve proper health care and retirement benefits, but it is the job of the union and private companies that made those promises, not taxpayers, to provide those benefits.

H.R. 244 contains a second health care bailout to Puerto Rico. In passing a bill to help Puerto Rico restructure its debts last year, lawmakers promised there would be no cash bailout. Yet, this bill would give the mismanaged and politically corrupt Puerto Rican government \$296 million in taxpayer dollars to cover their shortage in Medicaid funds.

Coupled with these two bailouts, the omnibus spending bill also funds liberal priorities and initiatives. H.R. 244 includes millions in increased funding for Department of Energy (DOE) pet projects, national parks, Amtrak, Head Start, college tuition assistance, the National Endowments for the Arts and Humanities, the Transportation Security Administration (TSA), and even a Bureau of Land Management (BLM) sage grouse conservation project.

When spending bills provide more funding to the National Institutes of Health (NIH) than border security, as this bill does, it's fair for conservatives to ask if this resembles more of an Obama administrationera spending bill than a Trump one.

The Heritage Foundation's Justin Bogie and Rachel Greszler acknowledge the bill "does make progress" on some issues, but they add:

"Unfortunately, the additional \$15 billion in defense spending is only half of what President Donald Trump requested earlier this year and is inadequate to meet global threats facing the country.

"The additional \$1.5 billion for border security is important in the battle to curb illegal immigration. However, none of these funds can be used for construction of a border wall, one of the president's top priorities.

"Unfortunately, none of the increases in spending proposed by this bill would be offset. Earlier this year, the president released a 'skinny budget' which proposed \$18 billion in 2017 cuts, yet none of those cuts made it into the latest budget deal."

Heritage Action opposes H.R. 244 and will include it as a key vote on our legislative scorecard.


[In 1941, America was the agenda of the patriots]

"Call him Joe Doakes or George Spelvin or just the great American yap—he is still the backbone of this country and as sturdy a citizen as there is. You've seen him at the ball parks, on buses, at county fairs and political rallies from coast to coast. You've even caught glimpses of him—and seen him squarely, too—in films once and again. But now you will see him about as clearly as Hollywood has ever made him out in Frank Capra's and Robert Riskin's superlative "Meet John Doe," which had its local première last evening at the Rivoli and Hollywood Theatres—you and countless other John Does.

For, in spite of a certain prolixity and an ending which is obviously a sop, this is by far the hardest-hitting and most trenchant picture on the theme of democracy that the Messrs. Capra and Riskin have yet made—and a glowing tribute to the anonymous citizen, too.

Actually, this is not our first introduction to John Doe. Mr. Capra has already presented him under the names of Longfellow Deeds and Jefferson Smith, the fellows, you remember, who went to town and to Washington, respectively. He is the honest and forthright fellow—confused, inconsistent but always sincere—who believes in the basic goodness of people and has the courage to fight hard for principles. When he went to town, he was fighting for a vague but comprehensible social ideal; in Washington, his adversaries were those who would use the United States Senate for corrupt and venal purposes.

But now, under the pseudonym of John Doe—John Willoughby is his real name—he finds himself confronted with a much more sinister and pertinent foe: the man—or, rather, the class—that would obtain dictatorial control by preying upon the democratic impulses and goodwill of the people of the land. In substance, the Messrs. Capra and Riskin are hinting broadly at the way this country might conceivably fall into the hands of a ruthless tyrant. It could happen here, they say—if it were not for the American John Doe.



For their story is that of a young fellow, a genial and aimless tramp, who is hoaxed into playing the role of a cynical social firebrand for the sake of a newspaper stunt. At first, he lolls in luxury while articles ag'in this and that are ghost-written for him and printed in the aggressive, unscrupulous sheet. Then, under the pleasantly romantic influence of his beautiful "ghost," he goes on the radio with a stirring and encouraging appeal to the "little man" for brotherly love and democratic good-will.

Immediately, and by virtue of his simple, sincere address, he becomes a national hero, the messiah for little people all around. John Doe Clubs are formed, a spontaneous "movement" gets under way. But then the guiding hand behind the whole set-up appears: the owner of the paper, a Napoleonic industrialist, indicates his intention of using the voting strength of the clubs to bludgeon his way into power. And, at this point, John Doe takes the bit in his teeth and gives courageous battle. The outcome is not resolved; in the end, John Doe is almost licked. But so, too, is his opponent, and an ideal has been preserved.

With an excellent script by Mr. Riskin—overwritten in many spots, it is true—Mr. Capra has produced a film, which is eloquent with affection

for gentle people, for the plain, unimpressive little people who want reassurance and faith. Many of his camera devices are magnificent in the scope of their suggestion, and always he tells his story well, with his customary expert spacing of comedy and serious drama. Only space prevents us from enthusing loudly about individual "touches."

And his cast is uniformly excellent. Gary Cooper, of course, is "John Doe" to the life and in the whole—shy, bewildered, non-aggressive, but a veritable tiger when aroused. Barbara Stanwyick plays the "ghost" and, incidentally, the dea ex machina with a proper brittleness, and Edward Arnold is, as usual, the diabolically disarming tycoon.

In supporting roles James Gleason makes a forbiddingly hard-boiled managing editor whose finer instincts are revealed in a superb drunk scene; and Walter Brennan, Harry Holman and Regis Toomey are distinguished among a host of character bits.

John Doe may not be the most profound or incisive fellow in this crosspurposed world of ours today. But he has an inspiring message for all good Americans. And he is charming company. We most heartily suggest you make his acquaintance at once.

D.B. Norton: You're an impostor, young fella. That's a pack of lies you're telling. Who wrote that speech for you?

Announcer: Ladies and Gentlemen, the disturbance you just heard was caused by someone in the audience who tried to heckle Mr. Doe. The speech will continue.

John Doe: Well, people like the Governor -- people like the Governor -and that fella there can -- can stop worrying. I'm not gonna talk about them. I'm gonna talk about us, the average guys, the John Does.

If anybody should ask you what the average John Doe is like, you couldn't tell him because he's a million and one things. He's Mr. Big and Mr. Small. He's simple and he's wise. It's no miracle because I see it happen once every year. And so do you -- at Christmas time. There's somethin' swell about the spirit of Christmas, to see what it does to people, all kinds of people.

Now, why can't that spirit, that same, warm Christmas spirit last the whole year around? Gosh, if it ever did, if each and every John Doe would make that spirit last 365 days out of the year, we'd develop such strength, we'd create such a tidal wave of good will that no human force could stand against it. Yes sir, my friends, the meek can only inherit the earth when the John Doe's start lovin' their neighbors.

Second Review

Frank Capra readily admitted that he thought Barbara Stanwyck wasn't good enough to be an actress when he first met her as a young girl. During their first meeting, she lashed out at him verbally. Having been kicked around Hollywood for months, Stanwyck was fed up with all the mind games and empty promises. Her tirade was the culmination of many frustrating meetings with directors, producers and advisors. Stanwyck accused Capra of wasting her time. She felt that he wasn't really interested in her abilities and only took the meeting out of professional courtesy.

Her behavior only solidified Capra's opinion of her as a "loose cannon". It wasn't until Stanwyck's husband (at the time) Frank Fay called Capra

and demanded that he see test footage of her before making any snap decisions that he changed his mind. Capra was sold on her and cast her in his 1930 film Ladies of Leisure. He would direct her in a total of five films, the last being 1941's Meet John Doe opposite Gary Cooper, who accepted the role without reading the script because he wanted to work with Stanwyck.

Stanwyck is Ann Mitchell, a writer for The Bulletin newspaper. When publisher D.B. Norton (Edward Arnold) takes over, he changes the name to The New Bulletin and demands a new format. This prompts the managing editor, Henry Connell (James Gleason) to fire Ann. The new paper needs stories that light a fire under people and Connell finds Ann's writing to be anything but exciting. Though she begs and pleads to keep her job, Connell insists that she finish her last column, collect her final paycheck and leave. Never one to back down easily, Ann has a brainstorm. She writes a column that includes a letter supposedly sent in by a man named "John Doe."

In the letter, Doe rants about the state of the world and the lack of goodwill in modern-day society. He ends his rant by vowing to commit suicide from the City Hall on Christmas Eve as a show of principle for his beliefs. In reality, there is no John Doe and Ann never received any such letter. She cooked up the scenario to give Connell the fireworks he wanted. Initially skeptical, Connell wants no parts of the publicity stunt until scores of people respond dramatically to the printed letter. It's then that he realizes the gold mine in front of him. Ann, as the author of the new recipe for success, demands her job back and \$1,000 bonus.

Connell complies and the paper immerses itself in the John Doe phenomenon. Now there's only one small detail to satisfy. Since there is no physical John Doe, they must figure out a way to find someone willing to pose as the mystery man. A crowd of men show up at the newspaper office, all claiming to be John Doe. Ann and Connell bring them in one by one to scrutinize. The majority are vagrants looking for a quick buck or an easy meal.



After hours of sifting through weathered faces, a man named John Willoughby (Gary Cooper) presents himself. Ann immediately perks up at the sight of the interesting prospect. Willoughby has not come to "audition" for the role of Doe, but rather in search of a job for himself and his friend "The Colonel" (Walter Brennan). The two are drifters.

Willoughby is a former pitcher who lost his career to an arm injury and The Colonel is more concerned with jumping freight trains from state to state. When Ann asks Willoughby about his willingness to assume the identity of John Doe, his reluctance is fueled by The Colonel's insistence that financial gain will only ruin him and attract the attention of "heelots" (The Colonel's term for bill collectors and salesman who prey on people with money).

After some reassuring words, Willoughby relents and agrees to take on the new persona. The paper continues to churn out letters supposedly written by Doe, in which he confronts every issue plaguing the common man. The ideal begins to catch on around the country and "John Doe" becomes a folk hero of sorts.

Bulletin publisher Norton soon devises a plan to use this to his political advantage. He instructs Ann to work directly with him and commissions her to pen a radio speech for Doe. The speech, Norton believes, will put their "discovery" over the top and grab the attention of every Tom, Dick and Harry (also known as the real voters). Ann has difficulty writing the speech. She toils for hours at home, throwing away drafts and losing her confidence in the process. Her mother (played by Spring Byington) suggests that she draw inspiration from her late father's diary. This proves to be the winning ingredient.

As Doe is preparing to make his radio debut, a columnist from competing publication The Chronicle tries to pay him in exchange for reading a different letter over the air. The Chronicle letter has Doe exposing the Bulletin's hoax. Though he agrees to do it (knowing that the payoff money will allow him to have his arm fixed), he bails on the deal at the last minute and reads Ann's original script instead. Doe is secretly in love with Ann and he knows that betraying her trust would shatter any chance he may have.

He begins to deliver in a shaky voice, nervously gripping the microphone stand and stumbling over ordinary words. However, by mid-speech he seems to boast a newfound confidence. Meanwhile, The Colonel keeps motioning towards an open door as a means of escape. Doe ignores his friend's suggestions and continues speaking until every last word has been proclaimed. The emotion overwhelms him and he bolts through the side door to run away as soon as he finishes.

Now resuming life as John Willoughby, he and The Colonel stop off for donuts in another town. Willoughby notices a truck driving by with a sign that reads "The John Doe Club". Ann and Norton catch up to Willoughby and try to persuade him to continue his artificial crusade.



He claims to want no part of the ruse or Ann's proposal of a national speaking tour. Suddenly, members of a local John Doe Club ask to speak with Willoughby (who they think is John Doe). He listens apprehensively to their stories of goodwill and newly formed friendships, all based around the ideals of his simple message of faith.

When Willoughby realizes the impact he's made, he resumes life as John Doe of his own free will. They embark on the speaking tour.

Doe is now completely in love with Ann and approaches her mother for advice on how to tell her. Meanwhile, Ann has gone to Norton's home for a meeting with various political figures who are trying to organize a John Doe convention. The convention will pack the numerous John Doe clubs from around the country into one venue for a speech to end all speeches.

Norton's plan is to pull the strings from behind the scenes by way of a strategically written script in which Doe announces his own political

party. He will naturally name Norton as his candidate of choice for the President of the United States. Ann is turned off by the idea of cheapening the movement but seems to have little say in the matter. Connell also disapproves of the tactic. He gets drunk and spills the beans to Doe, who storms off to Norton's house for a confrontation.

Once there, he notices Ann among the planning committee and promises to uphold the original message of hope despite Norton's attempt to capitalize on it. Ann runs after Doe and tries to go with him, but he ignores her and goes to the convention alone. As he begins to make his speech, Norton shows up with his committee and exposes Doe as a fraud



The crowd of supporters becomes a crowd of disillusioned people who turn hostile. Having no opportunity to tell his side of the story, Doe is chastised and takes to the streets as a loner. Ann is guiltridden and worried about Doe's safety.

She has fallen in love with him and feels remorse for starting the charade. In a moment of panic, it becomes evident to all that Doe may prove his sincerity by acting out the intentions of his first letter.

Gary Cooper and Barbara Stanwyck would make one more film together in 1941, Ball of Fire. Cooper already had a good amount of film work under his belt. His career began in the 1920s, playing bit parts and doing extra work, though he went uncredited for his first 12 roles. His first credited role was in 1926's Lightnin' Wins, where he received third billing.

He would go uncredited for a few more roles in the latter half of the 20s, but by the end of decade, he was making films every year and would continue to make films every year (with the exception of 1960) up until his death in 1961. He is often associated with western plots and cowboys, but also remembered as Lou Gehrig in The Pride of the Yankees

In this film, Cooper worked very well as the bumpkin-turned-activist. He perfected a technique of keeping his eyes low and glancing around quickly, as if confused out of innocence. The simplistic nature of his character made for a high level of believability. Cooper became John Doe. He was the embodiment of the ordinary man struggling to make it in a world dominated by big business.

Director Frank Capra must have noticed those qualities in Cooper from the beginning. He'd worked with Cooper once before in 1936's Mr. Deeds Goes to Town and wanted no one else for the role of Doe. Stanwyck was her usual unforgettable self. She often echoed her personal life through the characters she portrayed and Ann Mitchell was no exception. Her first show of ambition came through immediately, refusing to accept the loss of her job. With quick thinking, she orchestrated a way to be needed. Stanwyck always had the ability to command respect and make the viewer cry in the same sequence. It's a rare quality that few have mastered over the course of film history.

She was as tough as she was fragile, though when her glass jaw started to show, she guarded it with the fists of a champion. Like many classic films, the supporting cast of Meet John Doe was of particular importance. Walter Brennan as The Colonel was annoying, but in a good way. The Colonel was supposed to be annoying. He was paranoid, overly protective and a bit egotistical.

So, in that respect, Brennan played him in the best possible way. The viewer wants the John Doe movement to prosper and The Colonel's condescending attitude is anything but welcome. All in all, Meet John Doe is a great yarn about the foundation of humanity and how collectively, we can make the world a better place.

On Video

Meet John Doe is currently in the public domain. Having said that, there is no one superior DVD release. Like many films without a copyright, it has been released by various companies, mostly without any restoration or extras. For that reason alone, one release cannot be recommended over another. However, you will still find a link at the bottom of this review to purchase a copy.

As a side note, it should be mentioned that Meet John Doe is a film with a powerful message and deserves to be picked up by a studio for that reason, if not for its entertainment value alone. This film should be preserved for many future generations.

Conclusion

What hasn't already been said? Gary Cooper, Barbara Stanwyck and a story about society at its most basic level – it could only be memorable. The public has seen horror and tolerated violence.

At the very least, we can spend a little over two hours remembering what it means to be civil. Everyone knows a "John Doe" and some of us are "John Doe". There are bits of comedy mixed in to soften the harsh blow of reality, but in reality, the message comes through loud and clear courtesy of Hollywood's elite.




The pose may have cost a bit more but, nonetheless, we were all intrigued. The next day after early conference sessions, we all went to experience the man with the sign.



They needed to express their outrage and the outrage of all the little guys out there who were hoping Ryan would be a much better conservative leader than Boehner. Ryan needs to be fired. Here is what they wrote.:

Paul Ryan's first major legislative achievement is a total and complete sell-out of the American people masquerading as an appropriations bill.

Too harsh, you say? Let the programs, the spending, and the implications speak for themselves.

This is all old news but it was replayed in front of us again by the Same Paul Ryan on Mayday 2017. Say it ain't so Joe, but it is! You will know them by the scent of the swamp in the air as they go about their business.

You may recall about ten years ago when Congress lied to the American people and took credit for building a border fence and then never budgeted the funds. This was the 2006 Secure Fence Act. The more things change, the more they stay the same. I found the scenario similar to today and utterly amazing that this has been going on for so long that few can remember when Republican leaders had any guts.

On December 11, 2011, Republicans were at it again. Here is a part of a piece from conservativeviewsforthegrassroots.com:

"Republicans caved under pressure. ... though a twomonth extension won't solve things in the long term, it will help temporarily to give the 2 million people out of work some reprieve and spare doctors from a big Medicare cut. This will save each tax payer \$40 per paycheck. This is called deferring the battle for another day. In other words, Congress is being stupid. A two-month extension only perpetuates the uncertainty that too many employers already have in dealing with the economy and what's coming out of Washington. Prolonging the agony will not suffice the American people."

Conservatives have been begging Republicans to do their jobs for an awful long time. Republican leadership with orders from the Donor class and the K-Street swamp, have quietly refused. If history is our guide, and Republicans in Congress don't grow a spine, by this time next year we'll have higher taxes, higher spending, more debt and a bigger government."

Republicans have not only become wimpy on conservative issues, fiscal, social, and moral; they are also stupid, looking to Democrats for their next move. The bottom line on why it is time for conservatives to get it going ourselves comes from Douglas MacKinnon in late spring 2013. His article for Townhall.com is very compelling. I have already confessed in this book that when I tried to differentiate conservative from Republican years ago, I defined a real Republican as somebody with over \$50 million in the bank. Maybe it was more. Maybe it still is more. Most registered Republican Americans cannot afford to be real Republicans but regular American conservative Republicans had never been treated so small before this brand of RINO leadership got control.

So, my thesis is that Americans without the requisite \$50 million in the bank should leave the Republican Party and, along with those of US who are not comfortable in spelling "million"—we should form and join "The John Doe Party."

I see this as the bullet that would soon deprecate the Republican Party as few members of the party have \$50 million in the bank, but most are conservatives or at least anti-leftists. How can any political party exist without members? If Republicans want conservatives and normal John Doe Americans in the GOP ever in the future, they would have to reverse their trend towards liberal progressivism. With the recent Omnibus budget on Mayday 2017, I do not see that ever coming. It is probably too late anyway.

Some suggest that the way to win is to out-fund the opposition. Would this not be nice? But if the GOP plays the money game all the time, how can this work for regular John Doe Americans? It cannot!

Ironically the GOP forgets in between elections that it needs those "nasty conservatives." It needs the great unwashed masses in the party to vote for them or they would not have enough people to win any election. It really upsets me that such otherwise fine human beings (new Republicans who switched just to be with Trump), who can do so much for America, are being treated like they are not welcome by the GOP. It is how they treat us. Regular Americans have had enough. Good-by GOP. Hello John Doe Party

Shame on the leaders of the GOP!

Chapter 8 The Origin of Political Parties

American system today gives just two choices.

As many know, in countries around the world, there are often more than just a few political parties. Yet, in the United States there are only two parties that for years have been consistently competitive in elections.

Why is this the case? Are there any prospects of a third party emerging that can possibly be as powerful as the Republicans of 1854? How about a new party, The John Doe Party?

Will anti-leftists and conservatives consider the Reform, Green, Constitutional, or Libertarian Parties? Are these parties competitive with the Democrat and Republican Parties? In our lifetimes, have we ever seen third parties being successful in American politics? No, No, and No again, and unless we do something together, such as form and join The John Doe Party, it will stay that way.

The American system is commonly called a "two-party system" because historically, there have been only two major political parties with candidates competing for offices (especially in federal elections). Many already know that the first two political parties had their origins in the debate over the ratification of the Constitution. In the beginning of the country, there were two factions--the Federalists and the Anti-Federalists.

Today, the Republican and Democratic Parties dominate electoral politics. Almost every federal or state-level elected office in the United States is held by either a Republican or a Democrat. In fact, in the

United States Congress, in 2017, there were only two members in the US Senate who were not either Republican or Democrat.

They are Senator Bernie Sanders of Vermont (The Bern) and Senator Angus King of Maine. Both are independent but they support most of the leftist political whims of the Democrats.

Every other House member and Senator belong to either the Democratic or Republican Party. That gives US an idea of how difficult it would be to run for office without one of the two party's backing. It is still virtually impossible. That is why we need a new party—The John Doe Party.

The deck is stacked against true Americans who simply want to represent their neighbors and friends (constituents) to help the folks back home as well as the country as a whole. Both major parties would gang up on any effort to create a viable, enduring third party, and sometimes they even attack an independent candidate if the candidate has promise.

They may even do things that are illegal if they think they can get away with them or push the notions through the courts system. So, for antileftists and conservatives, it will be difficult to break away from the Republican Party but it sure appears that it would be well worth the effort. Things have become intolerable.

Our two-party system is the direct result of the way elections are structured in the United States. Representatives in the Congress and in state legislatures are elected to single-member districts where the individual with the most votes wins. Because only one party's candidate can win in each district, there is a strong incentive for political competitors to organize themselves into two competing "teams" or parties. It saves on money and it saves on effort.

By doing so, party members and their candidates maximize their chances of winning elections. In some counties where there are multimember districts, parties that win smaller percentages of the vote can often win some legislative representation. Consequently, in such systems, there is an incentive to form smaller "third" parties.

Other features of our system of elections at the highest levels include specific campaign finance rules, an electoral college rather than a direct vote for President, as well as rules giving various candidates ballot access—even write in capabilities. Not much of the laws governing ballot access are fair to regular Americans. They do work fine, however, for entrenched politicians. To learn more about the Electoral College, see amazon.com/author/brianwkelly. Look for a book titled: *The Electoral College for Dummies*.

All of these contrivances are designed by politicians to solidify the two-party system and to provide a distinct advantage for the incumbents from either or both parties. Individuals choosing to buck the system are permitted by the system to join in, but it is designed to make them all fail. Those candidates not sponsored by the elitists in one of the parties are made to look like fools if they choose to confront the constabulary—those who own the election process. The founders never thought Americans would be so slippery and so petty, but alas, we are.

We have all heard the term bi-partisan, which is a duping phrase for voters meaning that when Democrats and Republicans get together to fix things, it is OK. It means that the members of the two supposed hostile parties agree.

Members of two parties violently opposed to each other's notions have chosen to agree on certain matters that are important to citizens. Can you believe that they can do that if the fix is not in? When the parties apparently agree, and the "fix is in," it often means that somebody has been paid off. But, Americans, so wanting our elected representatives to be honest give them the benefit of the doubt.

Americans are too nice. We are inclined to give second chances and so history shows that we have a big problem throwing the bums out of office. Make no bones about it—all of this is our fault and the system will remain corrupt until we say, "Enough!" Then we must follow through with action that changes things.

Americans showed their mettle in electing Donald Trump as President. Now, we must throw back the bums to die in a drained swamp and we must join together to never permit government to get away from us again. We must form The John Doe Party and we must all become active to save our country.

I have experience in messing with the electoral system. I tried to get elected once to each chamber of Congress. I know from this experience that it is an unfair process and that is why we get the candidates we get and that is why wimps get elected to important offices. It is almost impossible for a regular American to get elected to national office unless they are either rich, or they take somebody else's money—I mean a lot of money.

This tacit collaboration of the parties would be called collusion and it would be a crime if two businesses chose to operate that way. Can you imagine Walmart and Sears deciding to use bipartisan logic to fix the prices of similar products, which they sell?

With two parties, the one big advantage is that there can be two distinct points of view, but today with RINO Republicans opting for the Democratic Way, the two-party system is hurting America. I took no money and I got 17% of the vote in the primary for Congress in PA in 2010, while my competitors each had over \$250,000 in their campaign treasuries.

Unfortunately, when our representatives spend so much time together in Washington, it is easy for them to join in unholy alliances of bipartisanship against the American people. These times in America are such times. The damage they do is worse than if Sears and Walmart got together to set prices. Yet there is no law that prohibits both political parties from thinking the same way.

If Sears and Walmart thought the same way, they would be arrested. Collusion or bipartisanship should be looked upon negatively by the people. But, first of course, the people have to begin to realize we are being snookered by corrupt politicians, and we have to be willing to push back against this corruption, or we will see America collapse in front of our eyes. Donald Trump's rise to prominence is a direct reflection of Americans disgust—being mad as hell—about the collusion of representatives for their own selfish interests.

Having run both for Congress and for the US Senate, I can give testimony that the deck is stacked against anybody without the support of one of the major parties. In other words, those features of our US election system that brought forth the two-party system also serve to effectively block the emergence of third parties or solo efforts by citizens, such as you or me, to seek office.

If you love America as I do, try running for office yourself some time before you get old, if you doubt me. Good candidates without political experience are tacitly excluded from the process. Ironically, most people before the Trump days would see a non-politico such as I running, and they would explain them away as not having experience. If you think about it, experience is an enabler of corruption and so Americans should look for fresh blood, not political hacks to help us solve the corruption problem in Congress and even in lesser offices.

Of course, there are established third parties such as the Libertarian Party, the Green Party, the Constitution Party, and others. Unfortunately, these parties have had little impact on the political process because their concerns have been fragmented among multiple constituencies.

There have been a number of other political parties that have come and gone over the years. History shows that when third parties emerge and hope to be recognized, their successes are short-lived. The Republican party was the last Party to come about and become widely successful. After 160 years, however, as we discussed in the seven chapters before this, it has outlived its usefulness.

Americans must change our way of thinking as the majority are convinced that they would be throwing their votes away if they choose to vote third party v. one or the other two major parties. They may be right. That is why we need The John Doe Party and it is up to all antileftist sin the country to make it a huge party.

The lack of success of third parties is true and strong parties such as the Republicans 160 years ago have not emerged because their efforts were not well orchestrated. It is a self-fulfilling prophecy, which we regular

people must work to destroy or only crafty politicians will be running for office.

Democrats and Republicans own the landscape and without force of some kind, they are not about to tell the American people that it is a good idea to vote third party. With no unique issues to stand on and then with eventual depleted voter support, third parties generally fade away. But, they do not have to do so, if the people can become energized.

The largest third party since the 1980s is the Libertarian Party, yet even this reasonably popular ideology with a party to match has not had much success in national elections. In the last eighty years, the left and right sides of the political spectrum have been served by the Democrats on the left and the Republicans on the right. Ironically the US political parties are not shaped as the corresponding parties in other parts of the world

For example, economic liberalism and classical liberalism have a central principle of limited government. Not so in the USA! These notions are supported by anti-leftist conservatives, who traditionally have been allied to the Republican Party in the US, and not to the left-leaning Democratic Party. In other words, liberalism is not liberalism.

As an anti-leftist mostly conservative Democrat, I have never had a deep love for the Republican Party. Yet, being an anti-leftist nationalist and conservative, I have always respected the Republican platform as an alternative to the liberal progressive agenda of the Democrats.

Republicans offered the only anti-leftist game in town that could win a national election. Consequently, rather than vote for progressive liberals, or choose to dilute my vote by going Libertarian, I found myself often voting Republican. A notable exception to this was when I twice supported Robert P. Casey Sr., a respected Pennsylvanian for Governor of Pennsylvania.

I would not support his son, current Senator Robert P. Casey Jr. from PA if dog catcher ever became a political office in our state. I ran against Senator Casev as a write-in Democrat in the PA Senatorial

Primary in 2012. Like most Republicans, Robert P. Casey Jr., a Democrat, is known as a "wimp" in his home town of Scranton PA. This particular apple fell far from the family tree, but Democrats do not care. Casey loves Obama and so he got elected twice. He's up again this year and I sure hope he falls hard. I'll do my best to make sure it happens-- http://www.kellyforussenate.com/. No, I am not running but I left my 2012 site up.

Things have changed in 2017. Like chameleons, many former conservative Republicans, such as RINOs John McCain, and Lindsey Graham, now openly embrace the principles of socialism and liberalism as espoused by the Democratic Party. In America, we are free to be who we wish. My advice on this issue is just don't ever trust them again.

Such faux conservatives, most often called RINOS by real anti-leftist conservatives, have taken control of the Republican Party. Conservatism in general is something Republicans are prepared to abandon. They think they have a better shot at the Hispanic vote without anti-leftists on their team.

Therefore, more and more anti-leftist conservatives are looking for an effective alternative, rather than wasting votes on RINOS. Many are considering the formerly unthinkable. Should we look for a new Party to join? When that decision is made, look for *The John Doe Party*.

I hope to join a new Party, hopefully the John Doe Party, built with American ideals. The new Party should be anti-leftist and nationalist in nature and a perfect name as noted previously would be The John Doe Party. What American would not want to be a member of a great party espousing a pro-American agenda, knowing that it was for America and Americans?

George Washington was not a two-party politician

Students of history know that George Washington became the first President under the Constitution in 1789, after the Constitution was ratified. There had been other presidents before Washington but not for the new Republic of America with its new Constitution. There were eight Presidents in the thirteen years after America declared its

independence and Washington's first term. The list includes patriots John Hancock and John Jay.

Washington served two four-year terms while being a member of no political party. There were no real political parties in Washington's time but that did not mean that all people were in accord on matters that were political in nature.

For example, in Washington's time, there were some issues with John Adams, his Vice President and the second President of the United States. Adams had many disagreements with Thomas Jefferson, Washington's Secretary of State. Adams was a federalist (state's rights) as was Jefferson but they disagreed on many other substantive issues. At the time Alexander Hamilton, a deep American patriot and the author of many of the Federalist Papers, was Secretary of the Treasury.

Additionally, according to the Constitution, candidates for President and Vice President did not run by party affiliation but instead they ran individually. Whichever candidate received the most votes became president and whichever got the second most was elected vice president. When John Adams ran for president upon the expiration of Washington's second term, his identified favored man for the VP job was Thomas Pinckney, but he came in third. In the third election for President of the US—the election of 1796, Thomas Jefferson, not Pinckney, came in second by only three votes to Adams.

And, so, even without a political party to assure accord at the top of the government, they served together for four years. This was the only time in America's history that political opponents served in the top two executive chairs. It did not mean they had to like each other or always agree.

The election of 1796 was the last time that such a contested American presidential election would occur but this time the President and Vice President were elected from opposing tickets. The two-party system was brewing but the laws gave it no standing. Adams' man did not automatically become Vice President. Instead and it bears repeating, Thomas Jefferson, from the opposing party was the VP in Adams first

term. When the Twelfth Amendment to the US Constitution was ratified, such a result became highly unlikely in the future.

As a review, federalism is a political concept in which a group of members are bound together by covenant with a governing representative head. The term "federalism" is also used to describe a system of government such as that used in the United States in which sovereignty is constitutionally divided between a central governing authority (the federal government) and constituent political units (such as states or provinces).

Those who felt as Jefferson believed that states possessed all the rights other than those rights which they freely might choose to give to the federal government, were known as the Jeffersonians. For comic relief, please note they were not known as the "Jefferson's."

They also believed in the full authority of the body of laws known as the Constitution. Just as anti-leftist conservatives today, the followers of Jefferson believed that a powerful central government posed a big threat to individual liberties. Their view was that the US was a confederation of sovereign entities (the states) which chose to band together for their common good, without giving the central group power over the parts. In essence, the common thought was that the states "owned" the Federal Government, and not vice versa.

Alexander Hamilton, another great patriot, who is known to have written many of the Federalist Papers leading up to the ratification of the Constitution, had a contrary opinion. He argued that a strong central government was a very good thing and in fact it was essential to the unity of the new nation. The Hamilton contingent favored a broad interpretation of the Constitution. They saw the document as something that should and would evolve with the country as it grew.

I took time several years ago to break up the huge multi-page sentences of the Federalist Papers and I produced a book published by Lets Go Publish! titled: *The Federalist Papers by Hamilton, Jay, & Madison*. I also wrote a small companion book to put the papers in perspective. It is titled *The Federalist Papers Companion*. Of course, I would recommend both. They sell well on Amazon and Kindle.

Political parties were not something that the founders as well as other leading political figures of the new country, including George Washington, were concerned about. They were happy without them. They believed that having political parties, such as the Whigs, and the Tories as they existed in England, would polarize citizens and paralyze government.

Look at the Democrats and the Republicans today to see why they had such great concerns. When the parties as today, go along to get along, the American people are the ones who feel the pain of their compromises.

Look what has happened to the Republicans and Democrats today. Hamilton and Jefferson both agreed with this notion. However, by the mid 1790's the two groups that they represented became separated by other ideologies and they had broken apart into separate factions. Hamilton's group became known as the "Federalists," while Jefferson's faction became the "Democratic Republicans." It is easier to refer to them as the "Jeffersonians."

The Jeffersonians differed strongly with the Hamiltonians on economic matters. The Democratic-Republicans believed in protecting the interests of the little guys -- working classes such as merchants, farmers, and laborers. They felt that an agrarian economy would best serve the regular citizens as opposed to the elites. There were no iPads or Smart Phones back then.

They did not like the idea of the establishment of a national bank of the United States (Hamilton strongly favored its establishment). They felt that such a mechanism, as our Federal Reserve Bank could be a means of usurping power that belonged to individual states. They were also concerned that such a bank would be tied too closely to the rich, and then again, the national government. They feared that people in a central government would become too powerful.

Of course, Jefferson was right, but a compromise with Hamilton would have perhaps kept the ideologues from clashing over the subsequent years.

The Federalists saw industry and manufacturing as the best means of domestic growth and economic self-sufficiency. They favored the existence of protective tariffs on imports (Congress adopted these in 1789), both as a means of protecting domestic production and as a source of revenue. This is still a good idea and recently I wrote two books, <u>RRR</u>, and <u>Saving America</u>, both of which recommend a return to these forms of mercantilism that originally made our country strong.

Our two-party system does not have to be!

It is probably obvious in this chapter that the two-party system is not required by the Constitution. As noted above, a number of patriots were in fact openly hostile to the idea of political parties. George Washington was one of them and he of course is quoted as being worried about the "baneful effects of the spirit of party" on the young Republic. Jefferson was even blunter in his criticism: "If I could not go to heaven but with a party, I would not go there at all."

Originally as discussed in this chapter, Hamilton and Adams won out over Jefferson but Jefferson would have his day. Ironically, Hamilton had a hard time getting his ideas across and adopted without having like-minded men on his side. So, to win passage of his programs, he formed coalitions with men of like minds and together these allies as noted became known as the Federalists. They recruited candidates to be successful in subsequent elections so as to increase their majority in the Congress.

Not to be outdone by others who did not want a reenactment of the English style Whigs and Tories on the American landscape, Madison and Jefferson, who were opponents of Hamilton's policies, formed their own political party as noted in this chapter.

The Federalists as they existed back then, were in many ways like the Democrat Party of today in that they believed in a strong central government, whereas the new Jeffersonian Democratic-Republicans believed that the federal government lacked the constitutional authority to implement Hamilton's agenda.

In many ways, they were like the strong-hearted Republicans of about ten or twenty or thirty years ago. They were very much like the antileftist conservatives of today. Because the Republicans are no longer who they once were, as I suspect you already know, I have been compelled to write this book. Would I not enjoy counsel from the great ones – Jefferson, Washington, Hamilton, and Madison? Can you imagine their perspective?

Ironically, the Democrats, as they would eventually become known, supported an agrarian-based economy that promoted the well-being of farmers and tradesmen. They were originally for successful industry but not for large businesses dominating the culture or large government taking what it wanted in taxes.

They sure do not sound like today's liberal progressive Democrats and this explains why our parents (I am a Democrat) had no problem being Democrats. At one time, they were the true party of the people. Today, Democrats are the party of the socialist / progressives and the communists, and any citizen operating in a fringe area. Democrats no longer try to get the white vote. When I understood that was true, I questioned why, being white, would I be a loyal Democrat.

Democrats today love constituents who are happy with destroying America with a huge Robin-Hood type government in which the objective is to make the people dependent on the government. I am waiting for the John Doe Party before I leave the Democrat Party. However, it would be nice if in the meantime, I could help Democratic leadership move to a different line of thinking. Yet, I am not holding my breath on Democrats ever changing.

The Democratic-Republicans were successful shortly after they were formed. In the election of 1800, they scored their first victory. Jefferson defeated John Adams in Adams' second attempt at the highest office in the land.

Encouraged by its success, the Democratic-Republican Party began organizing at the state and local level as well. Within just a few years, the D-R Party had become the dominant political party in the US. The egghead, Brainiac Federalists did not connect with the electorate and they appeared to represent only the elite and the wealthy portions of the American people, though this was not a fully accurate description.

Clearly there were far more people than successful people and so what Democratic Republicans could not achieve economically, they were able to achieve at the ballot box. In 1816, the Federalists were finished as they fielded their last presidential candidate, who lost in a landslide to James Monroe.

During his terms, President Madison (1809 to 1816), a Democratic Republican had succeeded in realizing certain big measures favored by the Federalists, for example a national bank and protective tariffs. This gave the Federalists in 1816 few issues to campaign on. This resulted in the overwhelming victory of James Monroe for the Democratic-Republicans in a battle against the Federalist nominee Rufus King of New York. This was just about the end of the Federalists.

Tid bits of the two-party system on the way to today

In a two-party system, just like in a basketball game, certain parties go on a run and win election after election, while the opposition party keeps losing. For example, let's jump ahead to the time between 1932 and 1980. The Democrats won seven of 11 presidential contests, and held both chambers of Congress for all but a few years. Yes, that means that the Republicans lost 4 of 11.

Backing up, as noted, the fledgling US got to test its constitutional precepts on elections way back in the elections of the late 1700's. The third one was really historic. It was one of the first peaceful transfers of power between opposing political parties ever in the political history of the world. It was certainly a first in a democracy (democratic republic).

The victorious Democratic-Republican Party were perhaps as surprised as anybody that power transferred without a fight. As an aside, as we have been promulgating so far in this book, the Democratic-Republican Party was a direct predecessor of the modern Democratic Party, and

thus it is considered to be the oldest continuous political party in the world.

Soon after the 1824 election, the Democratic-Republican Party officially split into the National Republicans (led by Adams and Henry Clay) and the Democratic Party (led by Jackson).

The notion of national conventions was not far off once the US political parties started to blossom into their current shape. The conventions were intended to galvanize party members for the coming election. The Democrats held their first-ever national convention in 1832. It was convened in Baltimore, Maryland, more or less as a big pep rally.

However, since there were always factions within parties, its upbeat tempo helped smooth over differences between several Party factions, and the principals and the delegates were able to rally the Party behind a single candidate for president.

The purpose of the convention was to choose a running mate for incumbent President Andrew Jackson. Secretary of State Martin Van Buren was nominated for Vice President and the convention endorsed Jackson's reelection. The first US convention of all time accomplished its mission.

Before the prototype of today's Republican Party came into being, a phenomenon in the 1840s and 1850s, known as the *Know-Nothing Party*, which many called The American Party, competed with the splintered off Republicans to replace the Whig Party to become the Democrats' major opposition.

Sergeant Schultz of Hogan's Heroes was not the founder of the "Know Nothings." As we all know, the infamous Schultz is well known for saving: "I know nothing!"

The Know-Nothings got their name because their membership was sworn to secrecy. They were permitted to say nothing but: I know nothing about it, when asked of their party affiliation. At one point, the Know-Nothings included in their ranks six governors, five senators, and 43 House members.

Chapter 9 Founding of the GOP & Its Long Success

Who's who—early politics—Democrats & the Whigs!

With the demise of the Federalists, who ironically at the time were emulating today's Democrats in their desire for a strong central government, while they also favored the rich and the elites, the newly empowered Democratic-Republicans began to dominate the political landscape. With the split during Andrew Jackson's times, the Democrat side of the split began to prosper. Life was so good, or so it seemed at the time, that President Monroe's term of office became known as the "era of good feeling."

Ironically, things were so good that the people stopped paying attention to politics and eligible voter turnout dropped dramatically—from more than 40 percent in 1812 to less than 10 percent in 1820. Voters felt they had little reason to go to the polls since the highly successful Democratic-Republican Party had decimated the Federalists and had brought them what appeared to be Nirvana even before Kurt Cobain.

No group of people can get along forever without a common enemy. With the Federalists out of the way, the Democratic-Republican Party began to squabble among themselves, much like the Republicans of today, who can't figure out left from right. Eventually, factions formed within the Party. They were as devastating to the health of the Party as if the Party had split in two.

To reflect the divisiveness within the Democratic-Republican Party, in the presidential election of 1824 the Party had five candidates ready to succeed James Monroe. War hero Andrew Jackson (War of 1812) won the popular vote. However, due to the Electoral College and the notion of delegates v. the popular vote, Jackson failed to receive a majority of electors.

Thus, to settle the squabble, the election was to be decided by the House of Representatives. In this interesting test of Democracy and the Constitution in action, runner-up John Quincy Adams, the son of the second President, become the victor by forging a deal with third-place finisher Henry Clay.

Jackson's supporters understandably were upset by what they saw as backroom deal-making, and splintered off to form what they called the "Democratic Party." They revived an old Jeffersonian coalition of farmers and tradesmen, and began to effectively organize at the national, state, and local level. They formed clubs and committees, holding rallies, established a chain of newspapers, and they raised a lot of money for their candidates. This technique can be used again as the secret to a successful John Doe Party organization. We can learn lots from the past.

The rallying cry of the new Democratic Party was the elimination of corruption in Washington. Wouldn't that be nice! The more things change the more they stay the same. Think of what the Republicans would be able to do if their backers chose to control the media by purchasing news outlets. But, unfortunately for America, Republicans in 2016 / 2017 have chosen to continue to be the "Wimp Party," and the elites with the money seem content that Democrats dominate the media.

Supporters of President John Quincy Adams, however, did not stand still. They responded by collecting together the rest of the factions of the Democratic-Republican Party and they joined with the outraged remnants of the old Federalist Party. They picked a poor name (Whigs) but their idea is as sound today as would be the John Doe Party when we are ready to pull it off.

Unfortunately, just as today, the Whigs, as they became known, lacked the Democrats' organization skills, and drive. They were soundly defeated in 1828, 1832, and 1836. They scored their only presidential

victories in 1840 and 1848 with war heroes William Henry Harrison and Zachary Taylor, respectively.

The wins had little to do with the party message and lots to do with their outstanding candidates. The Whig Party was doomed by its own ineptness—the same kind of ineptness and lack of purpose that is already dooming the Republican Party.

In many ways, the new parties held the same ideologies as their forerunners. Those on opposite camps did not trust each other a bit. However, they were quite consistent in their economic policy.

The new Whigs supported a national bank and tariffs as did the old Federalists. They hoped to protect manufacturers and use industry to keep the country strong. The Democrats were against the central bank and they were for low tariffs since this helped the farmers sell their wares abroad—even though they caused non-agrarian US employees to work for companies that were hurt by lower priced imported products.

Both parties were badly split over the slavery issue. Consequently, since they did not want it to be a debate point, the parties colluded to suppress slavery from becoming a national issue, as many in the R and D parties do today regarding abortion. Despite not wanting to talk about slavery, just as abortion today, it proved impossible as feelings and emotions intensified.

The Modern Democrats and the Modern Republicans

Through this book, I continue to encourage anti-leftist nationalists to form and then join the John Doe Party as the natural way to diminish and eventually eliminate the Republican Party for ostracizing anti-leftists and conservatives. Why? History is repeating itself as today's RINOS are led by a group of elitists much like the Whigs. Thus, the solution can be the same and it should happen today exactly as it happened in 1854. Yes, it can happen again in 2018 and in 2020. There was no Republican Party until the Whigs bit the dust, and there is yet to be a John Doe Party with strength enough to win until we all help the Republicans bite the dust.

Where there is opposition, there is opportunity. The Whigs were not much more than the old Federalist Party and their reluctance to discuss slavery became a big issue. In many ways, it was their undoing.

In 1854, a group of anti-slavery forces organized to form a third party. Out of the political party archives, they dug up the other half of the old name "Democratic-Republicans," and they took the other half as their moniker. They became the "Republicans."

There was no trace of a biased or corrupt media back then as there is today. Consequently, the regular people were not induced to hate Republicans simply because they were Republicans. Instead, the Republicans quickly attracted anti-slavery members from both of the two major parties. They also absorbed the pro-business elements of the dying Whig coalition. This is the same approach that can make The John Doe Party an overnight success.

The first Republican candidate for president

The first presidential candidate of the new Republicans was a man named John Fremont. He is not well known in history, and was not exceedingly popular in his day. Fremont was soundly defeated in the elections of 1856.

He was not a fan of the Constitution and he strongly advocated eliminating the separation of powers. From his perspective, just like Roosevelt and Obama ruling by Executive Orders, Wilson hoped he could unleash unlimited majority party government for his Party. Wilson, though a Democrat believed he could bring practicality to the demands of socialism, and he openly suggested that socialism should be the ruling ideology of his Party—the Democrat Party.

Thankfully, America is structured to survive people like Woodrow Wilson, Lyndon Baines Johnson, Franklin D. Roosevelt, and Barack H. Obama, and their innate desire to crush America, the land of the free.

Wilson would have done well as President of the USSR. Over time, poor leaders such as Wilson and Barack Hussein Obama are apt to appear, hoping to take all Americans down a trail that the founders never imagined. The Roosevelt years

Some call Franklin Roosevelt's victory in 1932 as a "realignment" of the political parties. The Great Depression was in full bloom, and Herbert Hoover had had a tough time making things better for Americans. Liberals would say that the Republican policies of industrialization, high tariffs, and unregulated commerce caused the depression, and

when they were replaced by Roosevelt's New Deal, things got better. This unfortunately was not the case for many poor Americans, but just like when Obama and the sycophant press ran the daily news, Roosevelt did not let had news leak out of his White House.

The New Deal was characterized by many as a patchwork of federal spending programs and government regulations designed to create a social safety net for low-income Americans, particularly union workers, who loved making the Roosevelt political coffers swell.

Though there were breadcrumbs for new immigrants, minorities, and small-business owners, there was little cause and effect improvement. Eventually everything got better when the war economy began. Even Roosevelt could not prevent true economic prosperity.

He was clearly America's commander in chief and a great hero during WWII.

Few Americans did not credit Roosevelt for America and the allies winning the big war. Just six months ago, before Donald Trump became our president, Barack Obama seemed quite pleased to be able to play footsie with our enemies. Hillary Clinton as Secretary of State did the same and because Americans knew she would do more damage if elected president, Americans who love America cut her off at the pass.

By the end of WWII, the USA had placed the Great Depression in the annals of past history and from its war manufacturing prowess, the country became one of the most powerful nations in the world. Nobody could compete with America. Of course, Harry Truman a great Democrat who loved America more than his party, was President at the war's end. FDR passed away on April 12, 1945, about five months before Truman ended the war.

Sometime great decisions need to be made by great people.

The Commander in Chief for most of WWII, FDR, was almost perfect in the war as he used all of his domestic talents, including fireside chats to lead the war effort. He was inspirational. The people were convinced he was the right guy at the right time. He enlisted the support of the American people on the Radio to help win the war. He was a great cheerleader but with sincerity.

If he had another motive in his Fireside speeches other than what was best for America, it was undetectable by normal people as well as a press that was quite discerning at the time. He was simply a hero in this regard and most Americans either never blamed him or forgave him for all of his poor economic policies. After the War, the economy boomed, as American industry was ready for a post-war restart. The economy not only restarted, it boomed. America was on top again.

Like many before him, Roosevelt's war record was not perfect. But, there are few historians that suggest that if somebody other than Franklin D. Roosevelt were president, the war would not have gone so well for the US and its allies. Yet, none of these war successes ever made FDR a great economist.

Without the war, there are a number of economists who suggest that Roosevelt, just like our prior president, Barack H. Obama, actually stopped the country from recovering sooner by whacking the producing class and limiting the number of jobs. If that sounds like Mr. Obama's and Ms. Clinton's probable recipe for success, just as in the Roosevelt days, there would be no jobs coming any time soon. But, in our times, the people said "no," and the people decided to trust Donald J. Trump to lead America.

Why did I change the name of my think tank from the Institute for Advanced Conservative Studies to the Institute for Advanced Anti-Leftist Studies?"

Here is the essay he wrote about why he switched parties. It makes any good anti-leftist conservative melt-away and be recharged with hope. I love this essay:

"Hello, my name is Elbert Lee Guillory, and I'm the senator for the twenty-fourth district right here in beautiful Louisiana. Recently I made what many are referring to as a bold decision to switch my party affiliation to the Republican Party. I wanted to take a moment to explain why I became a Republican, and also to explain why I don't think it was a bold decision at all. It is the right decision not only for me but for all my brothers and sisters in the black community.

You see, in recent history the Democrat Party has created the illusion that their agenda and their policies are what's best for black people. Somehow it has been forgotten that the Republican Party was founded in 1854 as an abolitionist movement with one simple creed: that slavery is a violation of the rights of man.

Frederick Douglass called Republicans the Party of freedom and progress, and the first Republican president was Abraham Lincoln, the author of the Emancipation Proclamation. It was the Republicans in Congress who authored the thirteenth, fourteenth, and fifteenth amendments giving former slaves citizenship, voting rights, and due process of law.

The Democrats on the other hand were the Party of Jim Crow. It was Democrats who defended the rights of slave owners. It was the Republican President Dwight Eisenhower who championed the Civil Rights Act of 1957, but it was Democrats in the Senate who filibustered the bill.

You see, at the heart of liberalism is the idea that only a great and powerful big government can be the benefactor of social justice for all Americans. But the left is only concerned with one thing—control. And they disguise this control as charity. Programs such as welfare, food stamps—these programs aren't designed to lift black Americans out of poverty, they were always intended as a mechanism for politicians to control the black community.

The idea that blacks, or anyone for that matter, need the government to get ahead in life is despicable. And even more important, this idea is a failure. Our communities are just as poor as they've always been. Our schools continue to fail children. Our prisons are filled with young black men who should be at home being fathers. Our self-initiative and our self-reliance have been sacrificed in exchange for allegiance to our overseers who control us by making us dependent on them.

Sometimes I wonder if the word freedom is tossed around so frequently in our society that it has become a cliché.

The idea of freedom is complex and it is all-encompassing. It's the idea that the economy must remain free of government persuasion. It's the idea that the press must operate without government intrusion. And it's the idea that the emails and phone records of Americans should remain free from government search and seizure. It's the idea that parents must be the decision makers in regards to their children's education not some government bureaucrat.

But most importantly, it is the idea that the individual must be free to pursue his or her own happiness free from government dependence and free from government control. Because to be truly free is to be reliant on no one other than the author of our destiny. These are the ideas at the core of the Republican Party, and it is why I am a Republican.

So, my brothers and sisters of the American community, please join with me today in abandoning the government plantation and the Party of disappointment. So that we may all echo the words of one Republican leader who famously said, free at last, free at last, thank God Almighty, we are free at last..."
