Preface:

I promised I would not alter a word that they might write. I was assured by enough of them that they would tell me why they hated Donald Trump. Yet, when the time came, they did not choose to deliver anything--even after reminders. No reply.

They did not do what they promised me so I have nothing from the other side (the hate-Trump side) other than some simple innocuous emails that I show you below. I found them in my email archives and though they are not really very caustic like the ones I thought I would get from the questionnaire, I found these few items below that did come from people I know who do, in fact, hate Trump as much as any that I know.

Response to a Bernie Sanders income email was "Wonder how much that person in the WH gave to charity. Why don't you open up a go fund me site for yourself."

All Trump loves is himself and could care less about you. You are too naive to see that.

BL

"Come on. The World's biggest immoral cheater crook never truthful and most importantly Coward. Five times coward and daily coward. My father spent nearly four years in WWII and for him and everyone else who has served I would love to beat the hell out of him."

MiRa

"Hi Brian, "Brilliant writer that you are perhaps you can send a letter to **King Donald** and explain what the Constitution says so that even the smartest King in whole world can understand it. To investigate... He is not above the law of the land, and Congress has the right to investigate the President."

--- End of examples---

No love there folks, for sure but like me, you have witnessed a lot more hate than these.

Those who agreed to answer a questionnaire, shown on the next page, did not supply anything. I think they feared the publicity.

Here is what I had asked for.

Many, who chose not to respond were among those who had told me originally that they absolutely hated the President. Nothing came from them. So though they had agreed, not one answer came from them to the questionnaire I show below:

What I would like to know, aka the questionnaire, is described in the following 13 questions:

- 1. Who first told you Trump was evil and bad?



Answer: Biblically speaking, there are positive and negative aspects to hatred. It is acceptable to hate those things that God hates; indeed, this is very much a proof of a right standing with God. "Let those who love the Lord hate evil" (Psalm 97:10a). Indeed, the closer our walk with the Lord and the more we fellowship with Him, the more conscious we will be of sin, both within and without.

Do we not grieve and burn with anger when God's name is maligned, when we see spiritual hypocrisy, when we see blatant unbelief and godless behavior? The more we understand God's attributes and love His character, the more we will be like Him and the more we will hate those things that are contrary to His Word and nature.

However, the hatred that is negative surely has to be that which is directed against others. The Lord mentions hatred in the Sermon on the Mount: "But I tell you that anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment" (Matthew 5:22). The Lord commands that not only should we be reconciled with our brother before we go before the Lord, but also that we do it quickly (Matthew 5:23-26).

The act of murder itself was certainly condemned, but hatred is a "heart" sin, and any hateful thought or act is an act of murder in God's eyes for which justice will be demanded, possibly not in this life but at the judgment. This is why the Scriptures tell us not to let a "root of bitterness" spring up in our hearts (Hebrews 12:15). Let us be careful to do as the Lord advised and keep short accounts with everyone about everything, no matter how small, and the Lord will be faithful to forgive, as He has promised (1 John 1:9; 2:1).

They continued to live in their family homes—not together—for six months before my father told my grandfather on my mother's side and eventually, he won the right to live at my mother's house. There was a lot of love there.

Dad got a job at the Stegmaer Brewery and they had a great life. They had five kids and we all had a great life. In a three bedroom home, with one bathroom. with grand mom and grandpop McKeown living with us, the nine of us went upstairs every night to sleep.

Young Trump's rules, because he had so many more things in his life, were intended to rein in the propensity rich kids have to be excessive. Trump had to have tougher rules to follow than I had. I watched my older brother, 5.5 years older than me grow up in front of me and I knew what our dad felt he did wrong. 

Trump the lesser could not plead his case and nobody was ready to plead it for him. So, he resigned himself to accept his medicine without even a ½ t-spoon of sugar.

As a real-estate developer, he built thousands of homes and also found considerable success with his own company.

I always felt my dad was very successful also. None of us ever compared ourselves to a potential image of a Trump so it was easy to be OK in our world. My dad, for example, worked for the Stegmaier Brewery until it went out of business when he was just 57 years old. At the time, I thought he was old but he lasted quite a lot longer and the Kelly's were happy about that.

At Stegmaier, dad was well respected and one of just a few who could handle their 600 can per minute flagship canning machine. By the time the Brewery folded, dad had "raised" us all and we all had jobs. I see my dad as having had a nice success in his business life but I know life was not easy for him in giving my siblings and I our great start in life.

The best we got from our father; was the best he could give. We had a warm home, plenty of food, and a lot of love. That's a lot. We expected nothing else and dad had nothing else to give. None of us went into business for ourselves until after our first careers were long over having worked for various small and large organizations in America.

None of Kelly siblings went to private schools

Whoops, I do have a sister that got a high school scholarship to a private school because she was both smart and holy. Eventually, she came home from this boarding school before she was nineteen. I may write a book about that one day, but my dad, a religious fellow himself often said that we (our family) would all get to heaven on the coat-tails of this wonderful person, my sister, his daughter, and her sacrifices on our behalf, for God.

If I had been admitted with scholarship to a private school, our family resources were so minimal that they could not have helped me if I messed up and was disciplined. Folks like you or I would have been thrown out of any school for just one miscue in the rules. They would relieve themselves of the burden of carrying us financially.

But, because of his unique status in life, a young Trump learned to frolic, game the system, and win the day. The private grade schools did not want to lose Fred Trump's favor. Trump Sr. would never be informed so the schools made do!

For all his years, Donald's father, Fred C. Trump's successes as a real estate developer paid for the private schools, the limousines and the twelve years in the 23-room house to which Donald and his four siblings grew accustomed.

Yet, Donald J. Trump also learned that comfort and security could be fleeting if his grades or his behavior were poor. His dad was tough and not a pushover at all.

The Military School Caper

When Donald was 13, for example, his father had enough of his shenanigans. He was not ready for tolerance. Instead he looked for a solution. As a sub-nine year old, I know that I still remember my longing to come up with the \$14.95 necessary to buy the Lionel Train Starter Set that was displayed at the American Auto Store. When I got my train as a nine-year-old, it was such a big deal for me in my life that later I memorialized it about five years ago by writing a book about titled: Four Dollars & Sixty-Two Cents. By the way this book still sells on Amazon at https://www.amazon.com//dp/0998268348. Trains surely were special in my life. Finally, I found something, a love of trains, which the president and I have in common.

Fred Trump wanted to be a good parent

Most parents want their kids to grow up to be successful but perhaps just as importantly, they want their offspring to become good people. I am sure your folks did and my folks did. Well Trump's folks did also. Fred Trump and his wife forbade their children from bad forms of behavior such as cursing, calling each other names and using nicknames and wearing lipstick, and there were surely a host of other prohibitions.

In his biography there is a story that Fred Trump "was really very kind of tightfisted," said Peter Brant, a newsprint magnate who was among Donald's closest childhood friends. "He didn't give Donald a whole bunch of rope."

As an example, he cites that in those years, it seemed that all youngsters yearned for the new mitts with intricate webbing that Rawlings had begun manufacturing. I knew that my dad could afford nothing at the top of the line. In fact, once my dad was assured that my jobs gave me enough money to buy a baseball mitt, that was good-enough, he too felt it was OK to not contribute to a mitt.

It was way too expensive, Fred told Donald, though he did agree to buy him a cheaper model so that he did not have to borrow a glove from a friend. If I did not have a paper route, I would not have had a baseball glove so I can relate to the importance for the young Trump, to have a mitt good enough to do the job of playing good baseball.

Some facts from Trump's biographer

Michael D'Antonio was the biographer who wrote "Never Enough: Donald Trump and the Pursuit of Success." His take was that Fred Trump's decision to send his son to military school was "a very severe response to a kid who hadn't gotten arrested and wasn't involved in drinking and drugging. He was essentially a smart aleck." "This was a profound rejection of Donald," he said.

He also wrote about Donald's reaction to military school: . "At the beginning, he didn't like the idea of being told what to do, like make your bed, shine your shoes, brush your teeth, clean the sink, do your homework..."

His mentor at the New York Military Academy was Theodore Dobias. Dobias has offered his take recently about the young Trump

and his time in the school: "We really didn't care whether he came from Rockefeller Center or whatever. He was just another name."

Dobias also noted that he could see that Trump had an innate drive for success: "He wanted to be number one. He wanted to be noticed. He wanted to be recognized. And he liked compliments." When he caught on to how it worked, he learned how to make the

best of what to him was a bad situation. Young Trump went from resentful of his surroundings to winning medals for neatness and he took great pride in his grades. Additionally, Trump distinguished himself on both the baseball and football teams.

The biographers could not miss the Trump legend at the school. The word was that by his senior year, Trump became known for bringing stylish women to campus and showing them around. "They were beautiful, gorgeous women, dressed out of Saks Fifth Avenue," recalled one of his classmates, George White.

"Ladies Man" read the caption beneath a photo in the senior yearbook of Trump. Trump always admired women. Picture shown on prior page.

Jeff Ortenau was a fellow cadet with whom Donald shared some thoughts and visions of life. Ortenaau notes that by the time he hit eighteen, Donald Trump had a "clear sense of his own destiny, a vision he shared."

"I'm going to be very famous one day," Donald promised.

"You know what?" Ortenau recalls telling Trump. "You're probably going to be president."

Chapter 7 Military School--Trump Won by Playing by the Rules

Donald Trump's freewheeling, off-the-cuff campaign style can sometimes make him look like he's winging it. Playing by the rules is not what the billionaire presidential candidate has ever been known for. But, there was a time when he learned that playing by the rules was more helpful than being a rascal.

There was this little-known time in his childhood — military school. Today's president learned well that playing the game meant following the rules. And Trump learned how to win at it.

When rules were meant to be broken

Before military school, Trump was famous for breaking the rules. Long before buildings would be named after him, schoolmates used the Trump name as shorthand for getting into trouble.

"We used to refer to our detention as a 'DT' — a 'Donny Trump' because he got more of them than most other people in the class," said Paul Onish, one of Trump's grade school classmates.

Onish calls Trump one of his best friends at the Kew-Forest School in Forest Hills, Queens. Trump attended the school through seventh grade, and the two of them got into trouble together constantly — the already mentioned offenses of talking out of turn during class. passing notes and throwing spitballs.

Onish remembers a few stunts on the soccer field, too.

"There was even a couple of incidences during half-time when we would eat whole oranges without peeling them in front of the competition to show them how tough we really were," Onish said.

Boys are boys and young adults are still kids. FYI, Joe Grant from the King's College in my Class of 1969 always talked about being tough and engaging in tough contests. Nobody got hurt. Of the weird things Grant did was take cigarette ashes and put them in his beer when we were almost drinking age, and then he'd say, "If your tough, you'll chug it." We all chugged it but it was not good for us.

Joe was hired for a great position at Kodak. He was the smartest IT major in our class. He developed regional enteritis, I think which meant that a few "tough contests" for Joe had gone bad. Kodak pulled back his hiring offer but IBM scobbed him up. He was a smart "dude" when we did not even use the term "dude." He's still living and still doing well. Kodak missed out on a bright young man to buoy their business.

Eating whole oranges with the peels all-on was nothing compared to engaging in a Joe Grant "tough" contest. Trump lived and so did Joe Grant. Isn't life great?

Getting sent up the river

It was the late 1950s — and in the quiet, well-to-do community of Jamaica Estates, Queens, the nonstop antics became embarrassing for Trump's parents.

So right before eighth grade, Trump's father sent him literally up the river to New York Military Academy in the Hudson Valley. Trump would spend the next five years there.

Retired Col. Ted Dobias remembers the tall, lanky kid who showed up at his dormitory.

"I put [him] down at the end of the hall. He didn't know how to make a bed. He didn't know how to shine his shoes. He had a problem, you know, with being a cadet. You know, being a cadet, you gotta take care of yourself," Dobias said.

And Trump the cadet didn't quite know how, at first. Dobias had a reputation for being one of the school's toughest instructors. He was a hardened World War II veteran who made it clear to Trump — he didn't care who his daddy was.

"When he got out of line, he got the same treatment like everybody else. His name was Donald Trump, like Johnny Jones. It was all the same," Dobias said. "Nobody was different. We treated everyone alike."

When following the rules becomes the Game

New York Military Academy, or NYMA, is tucked in a small speck of a town called Cornwall-on-Hudson. It's a short drive from West Point. Arriving here is like stepping back in time. Antique cannons squat on green fields. Buildings date back to the 1800s.

Back in Trump's day, cadets would wake up near the crack of dawn, hurry into their uniforms and march in formation to breakfast. First-year cadets had to eat their meals squared-off — lifting their forks in a right angle path into their mouths. And after breakfast, they'd

scurry back to clean their rooms for inspection. Dobias said it was a place where kids who didn't like following the rules learned to like it

.

"It's a hell of a thing for a kid to go to a military school — especially when you have to say, 'Yes sir,' 'No sir,' have to learn how to salute, how to do about-face, how to march, how to carry a gun," said Dobias.

But instead of recoiling from the discipline, Trump thrived under it.

In her book "The Trumps: Three Generations of Builders and a Presidential Candidate," Gwenda Blair notes how "Donald seemed to welcome being in a place with clear-cut parameters, a place where he could focus on figuring out how to come out on top and get what he wanted."

Mike Kabealo, one of Trump's roommates at NYMA, said in the confines of the school's rigid rules, Trump wanted to be a standout.

"Cocksure, positive and anything-you-can-do-I-can-do-better kind of stuff — you know, he was very competitive," Kabealo said.

And friends say Trump channeled that competitiveness into everything at military school. When he was in charge of the rifle rack, he cleaned the rifles obsessively. He was meticulous about his uniform. When it was his turn to do inspections in the barracks, he whipped other cadets into shape.

"My bed wasn't really made right, and he ripped it," said Ted Levine, another student who roomed with Trump at NYMA.

Trump tore Levine's sheets off during inspections one morning. Levine's bed hadn't passed muster.

"Then I lost it. I totally lost it. So I think I hit him with a broomstick," remembered Levine. "And he came back at me — with his hands. He was bigger than me. And it took three people to get him off me."

Levine was 4 feet 11 inches tall back then. Trump was 6 feet 2 inches. In the pecking order of young boys, that size gave Trump authority. It also helped him excel in athletics. Trump became captain of the baseball team, and Dobias was his coach.

"He was very coachable," Dobias said. "If I told him, 'Do this,' he'll do it. If I told him to do it the other way, he'll do it that way. So that's what made him a good baseball player. He accepted criticism. He wanted to be best. Not better."

Trump was made a cadet captain at NYMA — one of the highest honors for graduates.


And then there were the girls. Classmates said so many girls visited Trump on Sundays.

"The type of women who were coming up to see him or he was bringing were definitely from the upper levels of New York society," said classmate George White. "I mean, I remember there were so many, it was a revolving door."

Trump was voted "Ladies' Man" in his high school (military School) senior yearbook. His friends say he cared about his hair even then—growing it to the maximum length regulations would allow, so it would look fuller. Trump had learned to beat the regulations; not just comply.

I have never been the tallest or the strongest or the handsomest or the best athlete anyplace in life. But I have been close at times. In my high school, the guys that had most of those attributes often got caught up in being the strongest and the handsomest and the best athlete, and the prettiest girls fawned over them. They were cool.

Coming out of baseball practice one night, one of the guys at Meyers High who had such attributes I could only ask for a remake to get decided that he was going to show me how tough he was. Before I knew it, he was pushing me and saying things that even today I cannot remember. I got PO's. He had angered me. He was a lot taller than me but had never exhibited animus towards me before. It really bugged me. I would have taken ten black eyes to pound him once in the face that day after he treated me so badly. I held my ground.

My dad always told me to stand my ground. I had no idea to expect an attack from a teammate. I was a catcher and he was a pitcher at the time. I would not stand for the humiliation though it was just us two. Instead of backing way, I went forward with fists up and I don't know what happened but the "fight" was over as the tough guy backed off and decided he did not want to get roughed up. He said something to end the issue and I let him go.

I did not like to fight but I was ready. A lot of guys feel the same. I suspect Trump, especially a huge Trump intimidated a lot of guys. Yet overall, they became his friends. That happens. I know. The other baseball player and I are still friends ad we are both in our seventies. And coincidentally, we both are Trump supporters.

I am sure there are some but I recall not instances reviewing Trump history where he bloodied anybody up but being bigger than most, his classmates knew that he was capable of inflicting a powerful licking on anybody who chose to take him on. Trump had learned how to be tough at an early age.

Some thought that perhaps it was that quality that made it difficult to get close to Trump. I don't know but my biggest friend in college, who got a tryout letter from the Dallas Cowboys was a gentle giant. He was one of my favorites when he passed away just a few years ago. But now, more than 50 years later, Levine says he and the other guys still kind of admire Trump. If the Trump had been giving them bloody noses during their "friendship," they'd more than likely be bragging about it today. Big guys often just know who they are and they would rather just be friends than intimidators.

To show how they were lifetime buds, today Levine's office is littered with Donald Trump knickknacks. Like a talking Trump doll that belts out Trumpisms such as "Brand yourself and toot your own horn," and "Have an ego — there's nothing wrong with ego."

John Anstett, 76 years old, lives across the street from me. He gives me Dutch Uncle talks because he is five years older. His most famous advice is when he tells me to "Shine your own light." Thanks John.

His wife Carol is the boss of their home but when the truth is all known, the historians will find that when all is said and done, John always knew that Carol was always right.

Sometimes, Levine said, he squeezes his Trump doll for advice.

"It's reinforcement — positive reinforcement of true values that are very important for businessmen," he said.

Values like winning — how to fight back and win.

Levine gave the doll another squeeze.

"Never give up," the doll squawked. "Under any circumstances, never give up."

Levine said he didn't learn that one from Trump — they both learned that one in military school.

Military school was a tough pill to swallow for Trump and a lot of the "boys." Yet, overall, it gave Donald Trump the stamina to take any kind of crap that would ever be thrown at him.

Enumerating the reasons Trump is alright is especially necessary because of the constant vituperation he faces everyday from different liberal quarters. Here are 10 reasons I like Trump.

First, he is sui generis, a singularly unique individual who has single-handedly transformed almost everything about American politics, by sheer force of his personality and ideas. Presidents dream of being transformational, and Trump has transformed politics in ways many presidents can only dream about.

He has transformed both political parties, the mainstream media, and the presidential campaigns, and moved the Overton Window on many issues. He has shown many of our institutions for what they actually are and for what we suspected them to be, and broken their brains in the process. His methods may not always be good, but the results have been okay.

Second, by loudly questioning everything in his unorthodox way he has made us re-examine many things: our bloated bureaucracy, some of our egoistic federal civil servants who believe they're in charge of our republic, the much-vaunted liberal international order, our awful elites and the meritocracy that produced them. Most important, his foreign policy ideas and actions have generated a long- overdue discussion on America's global policeman role and its unsustainable costs to our people.

Third, he loves America, and his love is genuine, palpable and almost retro. We could do with a little of that nowadays, swimming as we are in a sea of self-loathing, self-flagellation,

and history-rewriting from the left. America, of course, has its flaws and sins, but it is refreshing to be reminded by our president that it still stands tall.

Fourth, he says what he thinks, is remarkably accessible, and is probably the only president who can't seem to resist answering questions thrown at him. In this, he demonstrates a guilelessness and, shall we say, honesty quite unlike any politician, past or present. It gets him into trouble, of course, but also gets him admirers.

His rhetorical style is, to say the least, unconventional but often effective. By talking like a real person and not trafficking in platitudes and liberal pieties, he has made it difficult for conventional politicians to do their thing.

Fifth, he is clearly a non-ideologue and pragmatic, shown in spades in the way he has refashioned the Republican Party's orthodoxies on trade, immigration, and foreign intervention.

Sixth, his care for American voters seems genuine, especially toward the people who voted for him and show him unflagging support. He is indeed an odd president: a Manhattan billionaire who has a "blue collar sensibility" and relates to voters who've suffered bipartisan neglect from D.C. politicians for decades.

And may I say that his rallies are a thing to behold: all camaraderie and affection between Trump and the crowd, characterized by his playful, extemporaneous riffs, funny and sarcastic, with the underlying theme being a conspiratorial partnership against the smug, self-dealing ruling class and media elites that need to be defeated. No wonder Democratic leaders are anxious about the 2020 election—they can't compete with Trump's offbeat charisma.

Not to mention that he's funny, but you need a special sensor to appreciate it, which the dour, humorless left doesn't have anymore.

Seventh, he has had the greatest influence, perhaps, in transforming how we talk about needless, endless foreign military incursions. He expresses in clear, succinct terms why America's global policeman role is getting to be untenable, as in his press conference after the raid on ISIS leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, when he stated, "But the United States taxpayer is not going to pay for the next fifty years (for endlessly staying in the region)."

One of his finer moments came when he mused movingly during a recent campaign rally about being present at Dover Air Force Base, seeing caskets return from war zones and witnessing the families' grief. Tenth and lastly, I like his chutzpah and pugilistic style, with its underlying theme of "Honey Badger don't care." It's perfectly suited for this moment, where the overarching issue is: Who is really in charge in this republic, the voters or arrogant, unelected federal bureaucrats who think they know best and try to override the will of voters? He seems uniquely suited to take on the combined onslaught coming from many quarters.

Obviously, I don't like or agree with everything Trump has said and done. Equally obviously, he has moral and ethical failings like many in D.C., but with a difference: he's no hypocrite and has never pretended to be something he's not, which can't be said of his many critics and adversaries. But his flaws and missteps are small potatoes compared to the decades-long, monumental corruption and dishonesty of our ruling and media elite, and the contempt they have toward voters.

The most fun and illuminating part has been watching the mainstream media, academia, Hollywood, and the Democratic Party rip their tolerant masks off and show themselves for what they actually are: vicious, intolerant people who are dangerous when backed into a corner.

I'm now squarely in the camp who believes that Trump is alright, and that nothing he says or does is worse than what the ruling class and media elites do and are capable of. He is far better—or at least far less worse—than them. Truly, as someone said, the office sought the man.

They were told every day, "Trump colluded." They were told every day, "Trump was a cheater." They were told every day that Trump colluded with Putin, that Trump stole the election. "Hillary was legitimate winner! Trump was not." They were told every day that Trump cheated, told every day that Trump was just the worst reprobate ever.

They believed it — and can you blame 'em? I mean, their media assured them of this. Now, they went into it believing it. I mean, they didn't need the media, but the media was reinforcement. This is one of the things that constantly amazes me. The media that has lied to and misled its entire audience has yet to apologize for it, has yet to ask any forgiveness, has yet to even

explain it. They just move on to the next phony hoax, taking what's left of their audience with them.

But these people are imbalanced to begin with. They're liberals. They're not solidly put together. They're not mentally adjusted anyway — and then you lie to them every day and you build up their expectations that what they want most in the world, Trump in jail, is only a matter of time away from happening. And, folks, I don't know how many of you took the time to watch all that. I did. From the New York Times, to the Washington Post, to CNN, to MSNBC, they did everything but promise that Trump was guilty.

CNN has not said they were wrong about anything. The New York Times hasn't said they were wrong about anything.

The Washington Post hasn't said they were wrong about anything. They keep reporting on Trump as though he's guilty of everything they accused him of starting even before the election. Their media keeps lying to them, keeps misleading them. But now, I told you. I told you late last week and the beginning of this week that this is beginning to take its toll, that I don't care how mixed up these people are, there reaches a point where even they are gonna stop trusting these people and stop listening to them.

Especially if there's no apology, if there's no acknowledgment that we got it wrong. If they keep pummeling it, people can't hang on to this with that much passion and energy. It's just going to dwindle. It's gonna fritter away. There is now developing a larger mistrust of the media by the media's own audience, and I think you see it in these audience figures. "MSNBC and CNN lost nearly a third of their respective prime time audiences compared to this time last year." It was the same three months ago.

It is a constant decline to now, for CNN and MSNBC. Well, CNN never did have much of an audience outside the airports. They would top out at a million. MSNBC, at one point, had four or five million. They're down now to barely over a million. They've lost practically 80% of it. It is a continuous slide. I think what's worth noting is that the ratings for these outlets and the circulation and subscription sales for the New York Times. Washington Post and all that...

They were somewhat bucked up after Trump won. I mean, that was Panic City, and the media was trusted. They were gonna give 'em the dirt every day, gonna make sure Trump was gonna go, make sure Trump was gonna be found guilty, make sure Trump was gonna lose office. You had all those people in their vagina hats flocking wherever they could to get their daily therapy sessions. They'd go to Pravda, they'd go to MSNBC, and that's what it became! Left-wing lunatics looked at the media as their therapists!

Remember when John Kerry lost in 2004, and there were therapists that opened shop down here in South Florida that helped Democrats deal with the shock? Well, imagine this nationwide, and imagine MSNBC and CNN and the New York Times becoming therapists for these people. So you have a hysterical story, and it was filled with hysteria! "Trump colluded! I don't think the Times could do anything to mess up its credibility with these people, but others, I think it only makes sense. To answer the question, "What's he being impeached for?" These people who bought everything the media assured them are now demanding that somebody make it happen, somebody get rid of this guy. And it's fallen to Jerry Nadler, Jerry Nadler of the House Judiciary Committee. [And, more recently, shifty Adam Schiff of the House Intel Committee because Pelosi could not trust Nadler.]

But here's a story from the AP, ladies and gentlemen. "Some Democrats Concerned as Judiciary Sets Impeachment Rules."

Now, this is a classic example of a story needing me to interpret it for you. 'Cause this is in the weeds. It's purposely in the weeds. This story is meant to get the facts out there but in a way most people won't understand, so the AP can say that they did their job.

Let me spell out this story. The mainstream media are pretending, and their legal experts are pretending, not to understand why Nadler is proceeding with this. They don't know why, they're trying to tell us they don't know why Nadler is going forward with his official impeachment hearings, because it makes no sense. It makes no sense to call a vote on this. It makes no sense for members of the House who won in 2018 from Trump districts, it makes no sense to put them on record here, and yet Nadler is [was] proceeding... {until Schiff took over all of a sudden.]

And so this story attempts to say that the media itself and their legal experts don't understand why Nadler's doing it, and that's a farce because they support Nadler doing it. They just don't want to admit that they support him doing it, either. The truth is that Nadler is proceeding and Pelosi is letting him proceed in the hopes — and that's all they've got — in the hopes that this phony impeachment inquiry is gonna fool some Obama or Clinton judge out there into forcing Trump to turn over documents like his tax returns that are protected by separation of powers and executive privilege.

They've got nothing. They never have had anything. Trump hasn't done anything that's impeachable, never once. Mueller's inquiry was to set up impeachment, and Mueller found nothing! There isn't anything! They're convinced that Trump did it nevertheless. They need his documents. So that's the phase that we're in now. And despite the media and some of these so-called moderate Democrats, of which there are none.

There are no moderate Democrats anymore. I don't care what the media talks about, refers to them as such, they don't exist. This story is about how some are concerned that Nadler's going ahead with this when secretly they want him to. Now, under the Constitution and legal precedent, a president could only be forced to turn over these documents if he's under an official impeachment investigation.

If there is an official impeachment investigation, then the separation of powers gets a little blurry. And it's possible then that some deranged Obama judge could come along and grant Nadler's committee access to, say, Trump's tax returns. And that's what Nadler and Pelosi are now doing, and they're only doing it because they've got to keep their base on board for the 2020 election, and their base is losing its mind.

Again, sorry for being repetitive. Their base has been lied to for two and a half years. Their base has been assured Trump did it, that Trump's guilty. Everybody they trust has told them, from media to elected officials, so, by God, they want 'em to go do it. They want 'em to find the evidence and get rid of the guy. Let's go to audio sound bites. Here is Jerry Nadler this morning, Capitol Hill House Judiciary Committee hearing considering a resolution on procedures for impeachment hearings.

NADLER: This committee is engaged in an investigation that will allow us to determine whether to recommend articles of impeachment with respect to President Trump. That is what we are doing. Some call this process an impeachment inquiry. Some call it an impeachment investigation. There's no legal difference

between these terms, and I no longer care to argue about the nomenclature. But let me clear up any remaining doubt. The conduct under investigation poses a threat to our democracy. We have an obligation to respond to this threat, and we are doing so.

RUSH: They can't name anything, but Trump's conduct poses a threat to our democracy. Here's Doug Collins, who is the ranking Republican on the committee.

COLLINS: We're so in fantasy land here, nobody knows what's going on. This is the problem. You just went back to what we said. Instagram, snapshot, Twitter, it doesn't matter. We're not in an impeachment inquiry!

RUSH: And we're not in one because there hasn't been a vote yet! Nadler's saying there is just to placate the lunatics on the left, but there isn't an official one yet, and there won't be unless some renegade judge clears the way for them to get Trump's tax returns or something like that.

BREAK TRANSCRIPT

RUSH: Grab sound bite number 13, Tom McClintock. This is another Republican reacting to the Jerry Nadler announcement that an "official" inquiry is underway. He doesn't care what you call it, they're doing it, and here... We had Doug Collins reacting to it basically saying (impression), "This is fantasyland. There's nothin' 'official' happenin' here. You're just tryin' to placate Twitter. You're trying to placate Instagram, Face Chat, InstantChat, whatever is, Mr. Chairman, but we know you got nothin'!" That was Doug Collins — a pretty good impersonation — and up next here's Tom McClintock with his take.

MCCLINTOCK: That's all you have to do! Resolve that the House authorizes the Judiciary Committee to conduct an inquiry into the impeachment of the president. It's that simple. I dare you to do it. In fact, I double-dog dare you to do it. Have the House vote on those 18 words and then go at it.

RUSH: Okay. Well, here's now audio sound bite 14. This is during the committee hearing considering the resolution on procedures for impeachment. This is after the vote, the chairman, Jerrold Nadler...

NADLER: The clerk will call the roll!

CLERK: Mr. Chairman, there are 24 ayes and 17 noes.

NADLER: Your ayes have it. The resolution is agreed to. This concludes our business for today.

RUSH: All right. So they're off and running. Pelosi really doesn't want this to happen; she could not stop it. So she's gotta make it look like she's on board — and I'm telling you, this is the inmates running the asylum. This is the Democrat base forcing it. Plus, Nadler is being primaried much the way Joe Crowley was primaried by Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, and he's got to try to protect his flank, and so that's that.

BREAK TRANSCRIPT

RUSH: Now, I want to go back for a moment to impeachment 'cause I've got some Pelosi sound bites, and I want to reiterate something about this. If you've done this yourself, if you've checked the news — if you paid any attention at all — you know that this entire procedure that Nadler was forced into doing, calling for a vote and having official inquiry or investigation... He doesn't want to argue about the nomenclature. The fact of the matter is everybody's calling this a circus. Everybody's calling it a joke. It has no aim. It has no objective. It doesn't look like it's organized. It doesn't have a central purpose other than to placate a bunch of malcontent voters.

And once again, I told you last week that the reason Pelosi doesn't want to vote on this is because of all of the Democrats that won in 2018 in Trump districts. You know, she doesn't care if Nadler blathers on about impeachment. If there's a vote, that puts people on the record — and there isn't a poll in America that shows anywhere near a majority of people want Trump

impeached. So there's nothing in it for the Democrats to do this except for fundraising and to placate their base.

Pelosi has lost control of the situation, and you'll see references to these "moderate Democrats from Trump districts who want or don't want..." There aren't any moderate Democrats, folks. That's just media misdirection and obfuscation. There aren't any moderate Democrats. I mean, they're trying to claim that, you know, Biden is a moderate. Biden doesn't know what he is anymore! Biden is saying whatever he has to say to sound like he is on the same page as all these radicals, but he doesn't know what he is. By the way, these people have a debate tonight, don't they, Mr. Snerdley? (interruption) That's right. It's in Houston.

The Democrats have a debate, and I guess Fauxcahontas is now the focus 'cause she's gonna be really going after Plugs. Kamala Harris is gonna be going after everybody because the bottom has fallen out of her campaign. So here is Pelosi. We have a couple of sound bites here starting at number 22. This was just this morning. She had her weekly press briefing. And reporter said, "Look, Madam Speaker, on the other topic of the day, impeachment, do you concede now that the impeachment inquiry into President Trump is underway?"

This has happened before, in the 1980s and '90s and early 2000s, but then the financial crisis arrived to save liberalism from certain destruction. Today leftists pray that Robert Mueller will put on his Superman outfit and save them again.

Of course the Mueller fiasco was a leftist ploy that was aided by the corrupt deep state and it failed predictably.

For now, though, the left's only issue is "We hate Trump." This is an instructive hatred, because what the left hates about Donald Trump is precisely what it hates about America. The implications are important, and painful.

Not that every leftist hates America. But the leftists I know do hate Mr. Trump's vulgarity, his unwillingness to walk away from a fight, his bluntness, his certainty that America is exceptional, his mistrust of intellectuals, his love of Occam's Razor—simple ideas that work, and his refusal to believe that men and women are interchangeable. Worst of all, he has no ideology except getting the job done. His goals are to do the task before him, not be pushed around, and otherwise to enjoy life. In short, he is a

typical American—except exaggerated, because he has no constraints to cramp his style except the ones he himself invents.

Mr. Gelernter, I could not help but to add comment. What a magnificent paragraph. Bravo! I love it and you have captured some of the many reasons in that paragraph why regular Joe's not worth much more than their selves and their opinions absolutely love the current president of the United States of America... Go Trump!

Mr. Trump lacks constraints because he is filthy rich and always has been and, unlike other rich men, he revels in wealth and feels no need to apologize—ever. He never learned to keep his real opinions to himself because he never had to. He never learned to be embarrassed that he is male, with ordinary male proclivities. Sometimes he has treated women disgracefully, for which Americans, left and right, are ashamed of him—as they are of JFK, [Warren Harding] and Bill Clinton.

But, like those three, Trump should be forgiven for at least his missteps were not at a time while he was making major decisions in the White House.

But my job as a voter is to choose the candidate who will do best for America. I am sorry about the coarseness of the unconstrained average American that Mr. Trump conveys. That coarseness is unpresidential and makes us look bad to other nations. On the other hand, many of his opponents worry too much about what other people think. I would love the esteem of France, Germany and Japan. But I don't find myself losing sleep over it.

The difference between citizens who hate Mr. Trump and those who can live with him—whether they love or merely tolerate him—comes down to their views of the typical American: the farmer, factory hand, auto mechanic, machinist, teamster, shop owner, clerk, software engineer, infantryman, truck driver, housewife. The leftist intellectuals I know say they dislike such people insofar as they tend to be conservative Republicans.

Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama know their real sins. They know how appalling such people are, with their stupid guns and loathsome churches. They have no money or permanent grievances to make them interesting and no Twitter followers to speak of. They skip Davos every year and watch Fox News. Not even the very best has the dazzling brilliance of a Chuck Schumer, not to mention a Michelle Obama. In truth they are dumb as sheep.

Mr. Trump reminds us who the average American really is. Not the average male American, or the average white American. We know for sure that, come 2020, intellectuals will be dumbfounded at the number of women and blacks who will vote for Mr. Trump. He might be realigning the political map: plain average Americans of every type vs. fancy ones.

Many left-wing intellectuals are counting on technology to do away with the jobs that sustain all those old-fashioned truck-driver-type people, but they are laughably wide of the mark. It is impossible to transport food and clothing, or hug your wife or girl or child, or sit silently with your best friend, over the Internet. Perhaps that's obvious, but to be an intellectual means nothing is obvious. Mr. Trump is no genius, but if you have mastered the obvious and add common sense, you are ninetenths of the way home. (Scholarship is fine, but the typical modern intellectual cheapens his learning with politics, and is proud to vary his teaching with broken-down left-wing junk.)

This all leads to an important question—one that will be dismissed indignantly today, but not by historians in the long run: Is it possible to hate Donald Trump but not the average American?

True, Mr. Trump is the "unconstrained" average citizen. Obviously you can hate some of his major characteristics—the infantile lack of self-control in his Twitter babble, his hitting back like a spiteful child bully—without hating the average American, who has no such tendencies. (Mr. Trump is improving in these two categories.) You might dislike the whole package. I wouldn't choose him as a friend, nor would he choose me. But what I see

on the left is often plain, unconditional hatred of which the hater—God forgive him—is proud. It's discouraging, even disgusting. And it does mean, I believe, that the Trump-hater truly does hate the average American—male or female, black or white. Often he hates America, too.

Granted, Mr. Trump is a parody of the average American, not the thing itself. To turn away is fair. But to hate him from your heart is revealing. Many Americans were ashamed when Ronald Reagan was elected. A movie actor? But the new direction he chose for America was a big success on balance, and Reagan turned into a great president. Evidently this country was intended to be run by amateurs after all—by plain citizens, not only lawyers and bureaucrats.

Those who voted for Mr. Trump, and will vote for his candidates this November [and next], worry about the nation, not its image. The president deserves our respect because Americans deserve it—not such fancy-pants extras as network commentators, socialist high-school teachers and eminent professors, but the basic human stuff that has made America great, and is making us greater all the time.

Mock us if you dare but America's finest come from all strata of life. As an Information Technology Professor myself, I expected Mr. Gelerntner to be a petulant pedantic elite but he was none of those. He is a concerned American as I am. God bless you sir. Can the rest of us see why he is concerned about the people we put into office?

The real Trump voter is left wanting – as is at times loudly proclaimed by their media voices like Ann Coulter and Tucker Carlson.'

On Tuesday night Donald Trump launched his re-election campaign with a by now classic rally in Orlando, Florida. It was a "greatest hits rally" in which he accused the Democrats of undermining democracy (by trying to impeach him), talked about the many threats to "this country as we know it", and even railed against Hillary Clinton (for old time's sake). In short, Trump's message for 2020 is: "I made America great again, now vote for me so I can Keep America Great."

Democrats will dismiss the speech as lacking ideas and just fearmongering, while reveling in recent polls that have virtually every major primary candidate defeat Trump in 2020, sometimes by a significant margin. They believe the president is weakened by a broad range of issues, including the Mueller report, the treatment of immigrants at the southern border and the various scandals surrounding key cabinet members.

Remarkably, given the traumatic experience of 2016, many Democrats have still not learned the key lesson of US democracy: elections are not won by passive majorities but by mobilized minorities. And while the passive majority might be with the Democrats, or at least not with Trump, the mobilized minority is. There are (at least) four reasons why, at this moment, Trump is cruising towards re-election.

The first reason is, of course, the economy. While we can argue about how meaningful and solid the current economic growth is, there is no denying that, in terms of the conventional economic indicators, the state of the US economy is excellent. Consequently, prediction models based primarily on economic indicators, which

correctly predicted the 2016 elections, predict a resounding Trump victory in 2020.

[By the way, the Democrats and as Rush Limbaugh calls them "The Drive-By Media are doing their best to dissuade Americans suggesting our lying eyes care not telling us how bad things really are. Humph! The Buzz is that things are bad but then again, the reality is that they are very good. VP Pence had this to say recently in response to those who say don't trust the good news: "Despite the irresponsible rhetoric of many in the mainstream media, the American economy is strong, and the U.S. economic outlook remains strong as well," Pence told the group in Detroit Monday. "Now, last week, despite some volatility in global markets, leading retailers also reported strong sales and earnings, and consumer spending posted its strongest reading since March. And under President Trump's leadership, as a son of the heartland myself, I couldn't be prouder to say that the automotive industry is roaring back here in Michigan and all across the heartland."

Second, Trump has so far delivered to his non-traditional base. The average Republican, commonly referred to as the "moderate Republican", is still not a fan of Trump, who is seen as too confrontational and vulgar, but got the one thing they care about: a tax cut. Scared of a "socialist backlash" within the Democratic party, they will come out to protect their new gains by voting Trump.

Similarly, the Christian right will once again come out strong. While the support for Trump by religious voters, puzzles liberals, it is pretty straightforward: the supreme court. Here, again, Trump has delivered. He has appointed two staunchly conservative anti-abortion judges to the supreme court, Neil Gorsuch and Brett Kavanaugh, and promised to appoint more. And with the possibility of (at least) one position possibly becoming vacant in the next presidential term, ie Ruth Bader Ginsburg (perhaps also Clarence Thomas), the Christian right mobilization will run on full cylinders again. The reward for the faithful: overturning Roe v Wade!

Finally, there is the real Trump supporter, the mostly blue-collar and lower-middle-class white voters who want to "build the wall" (nativism) and "drain the swamp" (populism). So far, they have not really gotten what they wanted. The swamp has barely been drained – rather, it has been expanded by corrupt Trump appointees – while,

despite all of Trump's grandstanding, the wall is still mostly a fence-in-building. In short, the real Trump voter is left wanting – as is at times loudly proclaimed by their media voices like Ann Coulter and Tucker Carlson. But where can they go? To the most diverse party in US history? The party of Bernie Sanders, Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, Stacey Abrams and Elizabeth Warren?

Trump can rightly claim that he has done all he could to keep the wall on the political agenda and push through a brutal anti-immigration agenda

But maybe they will stay at home, disappointed? Not really. They have not been betrayed by Trump. He can rightly claim that he has done all he could to keep the wall on the political agenda and push through a brutal anti-immigration agenda. He will claim that he has been "sabotaged" by the "deep state" and their corrupt helpers in Congress (including "weak" Republicans). Hence, he needs a second term to break the last resistance so that he can make good on his promises.

Third, against this mobilized minority stands a majority of Americans unhappy with Trump but largely uninspired by the Democratic party. They see a party without a clear profile, divided over more than 20 primary candidates, who differ on more than they agree on. Moreover, with still some 500 days to go until election day, Democrats are already turning against each other – with anti-Sanders donors trying to co-opt candidates, while Democratic insiders are feuding with the Sanders camp, which is fundraising against the Democratic establishment.

All of this is putty in the hands of the Trump campaign, the fourth reason the president is set for re-election. As should be clear by now, Trump actually ran a good campaign in 2016 – clearly much better than Clinton, who misread the rust belt states, among others. Trump has been running a "permanent presidential campaign" since his inauguration, which has picked up financial steam more recently. The campaign has been raking in money by the tens of millions, including from key Republican campaigners and donors who had spurned him in 2016.

Trump may be historically unpopular, but he is popular enough to be (comfortably) re-elected. His supporters have agency and urgency, the two things the Democrats are still lacking. They have 400 days left to create this, together, rather than apart.

Common grace raises up unpredictable vessels

As time goes by, even while old time progressives, liberals and others attached to the hate-filled Democrat Party consume more leftist and media hate and spread it like it is the gospel, the religious in America among many faiths are finding something special in President Donald J. This came home to me in the most shocking way as I replayed Donald Trump, like the Scottish heir to John Knox as he shouted back to the Vatican. "I am a Christian and I'm proud of it!"

It reminded me of Churchill who early on framed the contest with Hitler as a "battle for the survival of Christian civilization" He even insisted "Onward Christian Soldiers" be sung on board the ship where he and Roosevelt forged their alliance against the Axis powers. Lincoln quoted the Bible more than any President, yet refused to join any established church.

The question a Christian needs to ask, especially when their favorite candidate fails to get the nomination, is not, "Who is the most Christian?" Instead ask, "Who is the one anointed for the task?"

Trump Has the Cyrus Anointing

Common grace tells us that God acts in history in unusual ways to raise up unlikely deliverers for the sake of His purposes and His people. He disrupts nomination processes. In 1860, the pious evangelical Salmon P. Chase was a better Christian than the men he ran against, but the wily Lincoln got the nomination on the third ballot. Chase could not understand why God had denied him, but in the end the Springfield lawyer proved to be the most suitable vessel for the coming chaos.

From my perspective, there is a Cyrus anointing on Trump. He is as my friend Kim Clement said three years ago: "Gods Trumpet." I predicted his nomination and I believe he is the chaos candidate set apart to navigate us through the chaos that is coming to America. I think America is due for a shaking regardless of who is in office. I believe the 45th President is meant to be an Isaiah 45 Cyrus. With him in office, we have an authority in the Spirit to build the house of the Lord and restore the crumbling walls that separate us from cultural collapse; even then, this national project is likely to be done as Daniel prophesied, "in times of trouble" (Dan 9:25).

People keep asking me: "Is Trump a Christian?"

The genuineness of this connection was on full display in the acceptance speech he delivered in Cleveland where he thanked evangelicals and in a rare moment of emotional vulnerability spoke off script saying, "I don't know that I deserve it." This one moment reveals the true heart of the man.


and a good part of the precepts defined in this book are being implemented or are being planned in the Trump Administration. No, I do not think that he read my book but heck, maybe he did.

As a sideshot of hating Trump, in this chapter, we briefly explore the seemingly recent Democrat hate for God. You may say, "that's a stretch!" But, it is not. Look around. As far as Democrats' hating God, there are many reasons why this has happened. For example, Democrats are significantly more likely to be atheists than Republicans or the rest of the American population. We do know that they not only exist, atheist Democrats exist in some level of abundance.

Moreover, for some unexplained reason, in addition to being nonbelievers, many atheists express a strong hatred of God. Thus there is a likelihood that an atheist Democrat would, by definition, hate God.

Nonetheless, to some this is very clear, but to those who study matters such as this, they are at a loss to explain the phenomenon of an atheist hating God. Yet, they do and all you have to do is check the atheist blogs such as commonsenseatheism.com.

Here is the conundrum. How can you hate someone you don't believe in? Is that not a puzzlement? Why should you feel any hostility? If God really does not exist, would it not be expected that atheists would just relax and seek a good time before they become digested by the soil at life's end?

In other words, to an atheist, why should it matter if people believe in God? Carrying this to a logical conclusion would be that if atheism is true, then nothing matters.

Aldous Huxley (1894-1963) was a major English writer, novelist, and philosopher. He is the brother of the atheistic evolutionist Sir Julian Huxley, and the author of the highly read novel *A Brave New World*. He advocated a drug-fueled utopia and had some similarities of thinking to his brother Julian. In his writings, Aldous Huxley offers some reasons for his anti-Christian stance:

"I had motive for not wanting the world to have a meaning ... the philosophy of meaninglessness was essentially an instrument of liberation, sexual and political."

Huxley had little interest in moral constraints. Many who hate God want nothing to do with constraints. They would prefer a world in which they can make up their own rules or have no rules at all. If God does not exist, why not have it your way?

Experts have concluded that the secret to their unhappiness as atheists is that they are uncertain of their beliefs. How can we know anything about a subject that is virtually impossible to definitively prove or disprove?

So, in frustration perhaps, they hate God and Christians because they have no concrete level of confidence that God does not exist.

Moreover, they can be jealous of Christians who find solace in their belief of God.

Seeing Christians must remind them to some extent that they are suppressing the truth. Recent work by students of atheism, present arguments that there are far more non-believers in God in the modern era than ever before.

What does it mean if we find that 69 percent of Americans say a belief in God is an important part of being American? What about the other 31%?

Recent surveys have found that only one-in-ten Americans say that they do not believe in God. Less than that, a paltry 3 percent identify as atheist. However, there is always a new study when data is inconclusive and/or changing. I found such a new study does suggest that the true number of atheists could be much larger than 3%, perhaps even 10 times larger than previously estimated.

The fact that the study of God and the study of no-God (atheism) is ongoing means that the analysts must do their work in a condition of flux. Additionally as more researchers take up the mission, their various methods will differ as will their results.

In this book, we explore the *why* of a well-studied phenomenon—the hate of Trump. Our reporting is on Democrats and a major premise is that there are so many who hate Trump, that is not outlandish to generically conclude that Democrats hate God.

There are a number of sources for example that tell a story about 29% of Americans who identify themselves as Democrat. Similar sources conclude that 66% of atheists identify as Democrat. Working through all the analysis and theories by the numbers, a popularly accepted percentage of atheists in America is 3.1% of the population. But admittedly today this may be off by a factor of 10. Thus these are all theories and their basis is as solid as mush. But let's carry this math a bit further

Since 2/3 (66%) of the atheists are Democrats, that means that $(3.1 \times 0.666 =) 2.066\%$ of the population is both Democrat and atheist. And so, if 2.066% of the population are atheist Democrats and 29% of the population are Democrats, that would mean that (2.066 / 29 =) 0.07126 or 7.126% of Democrats are atheist. Of course as in all imperfect research, that conclusion may not be right.

When credible sources such as the Pew Research Center think 9% of the population meets the technical definition of being an atheist, this

would make 20.69 percent of self-identifying Democrats--what might be called "definition atheists".

How do you know when you hate someone? In my book, *The Cure for Hate !!!*, I explore the idea of hate quite extensively. The fact is that when you hate someone, you tend to speak evil of them, say negative things about them, call them names, accuse them of bad stuff, etc. Verbal condemnations reveal how a person feels about someone, so once a dialogue begins, the hate typically flows. This is often manifested in the hate Democrats outwardly show for President Trump.

Not all atheists react in the same way. Therefore, these are simply my personal generalities. However, those with much experience in such analysis would conclude that an atheist's regular condemnation of God, their accusations of his immorality, speaking evil of him, etc., clearly demonstrates that they hate God. And, a super majority of Democrat atheists hate God. I would say with that, I have proven my thesis and that is why Democrats hate God. Throwing Trump in the mix as a person who recently began to love God, makes the hate for Trump even stronger. ".

What about Democrat non-atheists? Do they hate God?

Hardest thing it's the hardest thing I have ... I was telling Tom Cotton, it's the hardest thing that I have to do. And I sign those letters, and it just, it breaks your heart.

Donald Trump: (01:33:45)

And by the way, there's a time to fight. Nobody fights harder than I do. But there's a time, and there's not necessarily a time. But I send these letters out, guite a few. 
