

She also does a great fill-in on the drums and she plays a myriad of other instruments including the violin. Besides all that, Katie's sweetly soft voice is like a musical instrument itself.

By the way, my grandpop, Edward J. Kelly, once joked that if my grand mom had given birth to triplets instead of twins (at the time it was not known that the twins—who will be 71 on their next birthday were coming), he would have named the third child *Jesus* as in *Jesus*, *Mary & Joseph*. I bet you did not know the father and mother of David and Ricky Nelson and the Ozzie & Harriett Show were part of a very successful band that got its start in the 1930's.

One more little diversion, please. From 1930 through the 1940s, the Nelson band recorded prolifically—first on Brunswick (1930–1933), then Vocation (1933–1934), then back to Brunswick (1934–1936), Bluebird (1937–1941), Victor (1941), and finally back to Bluebird (1941 through the 1940s).

The records of the Ozzie and Harriett Nelson band were consistently popular. Long before Mama Cass and Katie Kelly had their go at it, Ozzie Nelson had become the first vocalist to record "Dream a Little Dream of Me."

Ozzie recorded it in 1931 and he did a fine job. Other famous singers such as Louis Armstrong and Ella Fitzgerald also had a successful go with the song long before Mama Cass and the Mama's and the Papa's brought the forever version of the song to life in 1968. Katie Kelly added even more life to the song with her release in 2012. You'll like it.

With your Alexa, you can call out Ozzie Nelson, Mama Cass, and Katie Kelly and listen to "Dream a Little Dream of Me," by the three before you move forward with this book.

I know you're going to love this book and like Katie's mom and dad, and her two brothers, her uncles and aunts and the whole family including Wylie Ky Eyely and others, you are destined to love the music and soon be a Katie Kelly fan.

Dad says: "Katie has more talent in her pinkie than I have in my whole self." It is a "fact" to which my dad would swear. Think of it. She writes songs. She sings beautifully. She plays multiple instruments. She produces great sounding music.

You have no idea how proud I am of my daughter, Katie. Just like all fathers, I love my daughter immensely but after watching her trying to break into life over the last twenty-years, I am simply impressed. When Katie decides to be good at something, it happens after a quick study followed by a methodical implementation. Then, there she is, an expert or almost expert in whatever it is she has decided to master. I am not kidding.



A year ago, we had a major event occur while I was in the shower. At the same time, I learned later, my wife Pat had been sliding furniture around and she came upstairs to freshen up. She had had enough of that. Katie still pays attention to mom and dad, who today are each about seventy-three years old. I came out of the shower and clothed up and heard Pat complaining about a pain in her chest. We both have bad backs and so this was not an unusual circumstance at first. That was what I first thought.

Katie was on the scene and Pat's pain was intense and growing in

intensity. Nonetheless, her nature had her pooh-poohing the pain as if it were a sprain or strain as she always would.

But Katie waits for nothing when alerted and alarmed. Before I had exited the bathroom, she had secretly called the EMT's. Knowing her daughter. Pat had already cautioned Katie not to call an ambulance.

Thankfully, Katie did not listen. She would have none of it. Soon the EMT's were in the bedroom while Pat was on the edge of the bed, asking the proper questions. Nobody was more surprised than I when the EMT's calmly told Pat that she was having a heart attack and she would immediately be taken to the hospital.

Within several hours of arrival with me as the only visitor permitted in the ER room at Wilkes-Barre PA's General Hospital due to COVID, I met Dr. Ellis, a Cardiologist who is my own doctor's – Patrick Kerrigan D. O, personal cardiologist. He was dressed in a suit and said he would be changing right away into scrubs to go to the OR to work on my wife. He was conversing with Pat who was in deep pain at this time. He immediately took charge.

Dr. Ellis said to me I think (confusing moments) that he would be checking things out and more than likely would be installing a stent to stop what he believed without X-rays yet was a vessel blockage. He had to get the proper pictures



<>< Dr. John H. Ellis IV This preliminary work would determine where the blockage was so the Doctor's procedure would be properly directed. Thank God Dr. Ellis was not on vacation. He is one of the best.

After surgery he told me that her Widow Maker artery was occluded about 100% and he had put one very large stent in to

ease the pain and help normal blood flow begin. He anticipated a full recovery over time. Pat was in the hospital six days. When all the fuss was over, I knew and everybody else knew that besides Dr. Ellis, Katie Kelly's prompt action had saved her mother's life.

It was all a shock to the family but my wife Pat is a scrapper and worked hard to recover and she is doing very well today. In fact, her heart function was at about 19% after the stent was installed. Normal is above 60. This week in July, her Muga-Scan (phonetic sound) was at 45. Perhaps this warrants no cigar but before a year was up, my dear wife Pat had more than doubled her heart strength. She would not have had a chance if it were not for the quick thinking of Katie Kelly who brought help immediately.

When you hit a certain age and have older children living with you, they are always looking over your well-being even if you don't know it. I found myself in the ER several times over the last several years because of Katie's vigilance. Each time, after the requisite tests, they would release me and life would go on. Thank you Katie.

On July 10, 2021, Katie found her dad had the chills and was nauseous and she could come up with no logical reason for it so without consultation, she called the EMTs. They checked the temperature. Mine is typically in the 97-range. It was approaching 101. I was shivering but I had always recovered from such episodes in the past with no repercussions. The EMTs left it up to me but said the safe bet was to get checked out in the ER. Katie and mom insisted I go to the hospital. Not ever being accused of ignoring sound advice, I agreed.

After they took blood cultures and regular blood and my fever seemed to be lessening by itself, they felt I could go home without admission. With no empirical evidence other than that I was improving, they concluded I must have had something like a 24-hour virus. It took til almost midnight--about ten hours after arrival that I was eventually discharged from the ER.

I normally get up for mass on Sunday or watch the 8:00 mass for the shut-ins. I am 73 and Pat is 74 and we had an excuse during COVID to not attend mass in person. We found a great mass.

I had been feeling so bad with no rest that I slept until noon on Sunday, July 11 – a 12-hour snooze. Then, I felt great

Later in the afternoon, about 5:00 P.M. as I was engaging with my writing computer, I felt good enough to have a red wine. Check out my book called WineDiets.com presents: The Wine Diet on Amazon.

While half way through the one glass of red wine that I permitted myself, the phone rang from General Hospital's ER.

I answered it. The PA (Physician's Assistant) Mike, who had treated me on Saturday said they had found some results that were not good in the blood cultures taken on Saturday and asked if I could come in to have them verified and /or receive IV antibiotics. Katie again insisted I not wait any longer and get right over to the hospital. I was admitted Sunday evening and finally got a bed (full house) about 1:00 A.M. .

I was discharged on Friday July 16, with a PICC line for IV antibiotics to be administered over a 24 day period three times a day. Molly from Angel Touch is the nurse in charge of my home health.

She taught my wife Pat and daughter Katie to administer the antibiotics via syringe and the nine step process including saline solution was done 100% accurately. Their teacher, Molly from Angel Touch Home Health assured they did it right. Katie again took the lead. They were 100% perfect in their delivery of the antibiotics (a nine step process). They are both sharpies. Katie is now the lead in administering antibiotics to her father. I am a lucky man.

Chapter 2 The Real Origins of Katie Kelly

The stork delivered Katie's brothers Brian & Michael to the Mercy Hospital a few years before he brought our baby girl, Kathleen Patricia Kelly (aka Katie). She had to be a great athlete and a great student growing up with two older brothers. She was definitely that, but to me she was daddy's little girl from day one.

The boys knew there were tolerance limits about what they could get away with—with their little sister. Nonetheless when mom and dad were not within earshot in Katie's early years, I know she endured a lot. Confirmation of that fact came when we had to take her to an ENT doctor for a problem with her vocal chords (nodule). The prognosis was that she would be fine but the one question the Dr. asked caused mom and I to look at each other:

"Does she scream and yell a lot – I mean like at her brothers." It turns out that Katie velled as a defense mechanism to end the name-calling and some of the other torment from her older siblings. The boys thought it was fun but Katie did not like it one bit. After just a little time after that, her vocal chords were no longer inflamed and life became normal again at home. It is funny now but not then.

I sometimes wonder if all that screaming ultimately did not strengthen her chords and her voice box to help make her the powerful singer that she is today—with full control over her voice.

Katie got along with everybody in grade school. She was in advanced placement and was fortunate enough to have the best public school teachers. To show how adept she was in so many things, let me tell you about her academic and athletic experiences way back at Kistler Grade School in Wilkes-Barre.

She was an A-student all the way and in grades 4 through six, she was the #1 student in the school in the Iowa Achievement Tests. Strong mind and a strong body.

From the first time she saw a soccer ball, Katie began to play soccer in front of the house. It was all the time with her brothers who started for the HS soccer team as sophomores. Additionally, she played one on one soccer in front of the house with an all-scholastic soccer player from across the street.

Each year Kistler School ran a race several times around a huge park called Miner Park. Students in grades 4 through 6 were invited to compete. Katie took up the challenge as did a majority of the kids at the school. Few people were ever repeat champions. If they won the race as a fourth grader it was less likely for them to win as a fifth grader. If there is a record for the race, Katie holds it or ties it. She came in first place in 4th, 5th, & 6th before she graduated to Junior High. Ouite an athlete—quite an achievement.

Katie then starred on the Jr. High Boys soccer team. As a freshman, she played on the Varsity Girls Soccer team with other girls from 9th grade to 12th. As a ninth grader, she had the honor of shooting all the penalty kicks. It was a rare circumstance when she did not score. I did not miss a game for all my kids but I can honestly say I can't recall Katie ever missing a penalty kick score--ever.

She graduated from Luzerne County Community College and played mid-fielder on their championship soccer team. All those years playing soccer with the boys had certainly paid off.

Her brothers Michael and Brian are both lawyers. Michael has his own firm and Katie currently serves as his major paralegal. She has no advantage being the boss's brother. I know that from observation.

Time to bring out the musical talent

In her Junior Year at Meyers High School, Katie decided to enter a school sponsored talent contest. In 1987 when we moved to our new home, I purchased a nice piano with some IBM bonus money. As little kids, Brian, Mike and Katie all took lessons on the piano.


Brian is an accomplished pianist with many recordings and Katie has five albums which she produced, directed, and in which she performed all the vocals for all the songs. She formed several bands and plays a myriad of instruments. She has perfected her craft. She got started in her public music career after winning the school talent contest playing the guitar (mostly self-taught) and singing a few cover songs such as Bette Midler's "The Rose."

The rest is history and we explore that in some reasonable detail in this book. Hope you enjoy!

Chapter 3 Becoming a Local Singing Sensation

For a number of years, as she was learning her new favorite trade, Katie played solo at charitable events. I helped her buy some light equipment, which made it easier for her to move from venue to venue. She would always make a charity date when asked.

Her mom and I have a routine in which at least half of the Fridays in the year, we go to a happy hour. One of our favorite haunts over our early years was a place called the Station and then when it closed, we would go to Murray's Inn, which was a charming place. It had a reserved area for a stage and the whole establishment had been resurrected from the old Hazard Wire Company. They often had front-line entertainment. The site was recently demolished.



By the way, the complex has a lot of history. The Hazard / Okonite sold nationwide. Hazard and Hazard-Okonite products include the Golden Gate Bridge, oil wells in Texas, and fire alarm systems in cities

nationwide, The company's founders once forged cannonballs used in the War of 1812 and later, the output of the massive brick buildings in Wilkes-Barre included anti-submarine nets for U.S. harbors, placed during World War I and World War II.

Peak employment was 794 people in 1951. Closing of the Hazard Insulated Wire Division of the Okonite Company came shortly thereafter, in December 1956. The place was most recently known as the Murray Complex,.

One day my wife Pat and I asked Tom Murray if Katie could play for tips and he agreed. My great friend Gerry Rodski who was lead guitarist for the Cobras in the 1960's and later with the East Coast Blues Ensemble helped Katie set up at Murrays each time and he loaned some great equipment. That's what friends are for. When Katie began to play, she initially teamed with her brother Brian who brought his Roland keyboard and amplifier to the gigs.

Katie would play together with Brian and then they would play separately. Brian writes a lot of music for the piano and keyboard. Over the hears Pat and I would help Katie get gigs in other spots such as CrisNics and Keats' Pub. It did not take Katie long to be out on her own getting gigs, promoting them, and then she ventured into producing albums with the bands that she formed over the years.

In the fall of 2012, Katie had just completed her debut album "Three Dark Days." She had been hoping to form a band. Kate was looking for a full band to perform the album's songs at an album release party. She had been playing off and on with Ray Novitski for a few years and asked if he'd like to join in on the show. Novitski's unique guitar style brought something new to the tunes. She created a group called "The Charming Beards" and they began to take shape, using the Folk/Americana tracks from her album and blending them with what would be called a new instrumentation.

After their album release party, by her next show, her good friend and also her brother Brian's friend Theresa Lazarri jumped on the Katie Kelly bandwagon to play the drums. Katie loved Theresa's style which was both very passionate and heavy hitting. Katie was always trying something new.

It was not long afterward that Katie picked up an electric guitar, which brought a more rugged edge to the overall effect of the sound.

The group had great chemistry and together the combination helped produce a variety of new songs. They practiced at least once a week in a loft over our garage which also had access through the house. I had remodeled the loft to be my office but I never moved my business there because it would have taken me out of the goings-on of the family home. The seclusion of the loft was perfect, however, for the practice sessions.

At one whiskey filled practice (they were kids from my perspective but all were of the legal age), the group discussed incidences of drunken people urinating in the kitchen. Though an unpleasant thought to mom and I, artists are artists. This experience led to their rockabilly tune "Pissin' in the Kitchen." It is billed as an upbeat, dance-able ode to making social messes. Ahem!

The band gained great credentials, performing many shows in the local original music scene, including opening up for national acts, Hank and Cupcakes, Kaleigh Baker, Alex Culbreth, and Black Horse Motel.

Katie posted this in 2013 as the band was picking up steam.



Super nervous and excited for tonight. Playing promptly at 8pm at the Vintage Theater (326 Spruce Street Scranton) with a gigantic 6 piece. Katie Kelly and the Charming Beards is: Fred Emmett on drums Chad Mummert on bass Ray Novitski on leadspaceman guitar/vocals, Danielle Barbuti on percussion, Aaron McCurdy on mandolin/vocals, and yours truly. We have the distinct pleasure of sharing the stage with Instead of Sleeping and Those Clever Foxes.

In 2014, the group asked Mark Wohl (Wide Eyed Studios) to set up remotely at their rehearsal space in our loft. Led by Katie, the group was interested in capturing a raw sound for their debut EP, "Cigarettes and Whiskey." The title track was nominated for a Steamtown Music Award.

Theresa later moved to Philadelphia, but the band continued to play shows with her as her schedule would permit. She would make the trek to the area and join the band for gigs.

In 2016,Katie and The Charming Beards signed up a new bassist to join the band. The Charming Beards were quite pleased when their band was now just about complete. Another person – this one from Jump the Train, also joined the group. Katie bought a used set of drums and began to practice just in case she had to play. She learned to play so many different instruments, she was poised to take over as needed in any scenario. The practice loft seemed to be decreasing in size with all the band paraphernalia.

The modcabin.com had this to say about the Charming Beards at their best:

Every once in a while we have the good fortune of stumbling across an excellent band totally out of the blue. Katie Kelly and the Charming Beards is one of those cases. I recently had the chance to listen to their album Three Dark Days after randomly reading a newspaper clipping about one of their upcoming shows.

I listened to the album simply because of the name of the band, and didn't have high expectations. I was pleasantly surprised to hear a beautifully haunting folk album. The lyrics are heart felt and deal with some very dark topics. It is clear that Katie Kelly pours her entire heart and soul into her music. I was blown away by the eerie melodies of Bless Me Father and Some Kind of lover.





Chapter 5 Early Music Life And An Album Release

A little perspective after an early Charming Beards album release

Katie Kelly & The Charming Beards have been playing together since 2012, but until this week, the only way you could hear the Wilkes-Barre band's music was at its shows. That finally changed this year with the group's release of "Cigarettes and Whiskey," its 5-song debut EP.

The band — Kelly (vocals, guitar), Ray Novitski (guitar) and Theresa Lazzari (drums) — fine-tuned their live act at various venues and events in Northeastern Pa. before capturing their live energy in the studio with Mark Wohl, of area band Mock Sun.

The Charming Beards didn't have much time to finish tracking, as Theresa Lazzari (RIP) was about to move to Philadelphia. Here are some perspecives Katie Kelly has about her work including the track "Shining Star," which makes its debut here today — the definition of "outerfolk" and what's next for her and The Charming Beards.

What is Outerfolk?

Katie can pick up a term and begin using it and it seems natural but since not everybody gets her Katie Speak, so to speak, she is pleased to say that it is a term that came up from her many conversations with bandmates and people within our musical family. For a while, The Charming Beards were expected to play conventional folk music at gigs, and when we didn't... well, we lost two very big gigs because of it.

Here is a Katie perspective on this time in her music career: "I was very worried that my songwriting and music was heading into a slightly different direction. It was more than just simply switching to an electric guitar. I love folk music and will always love playing it, so the new direction never abandoned anything, it rather expanded upon it.

So, while chatting with Theresa, Ray and Rennin Davidson (of Harlot), we agreed on a meaning of Outerfolk. Attaching a genre to your music is a difficult task anyway and leads to confusion, so we figured we'd invent our own.

I loosely defined Outerfolk as a genre of music that incorporates the tradition of telling a story in its songwriting, but has alternative instrumentation and arrangement. For example, I will write a song on an acoustic guitar that if played live would sound like Appalachian folk, but with the addition of Theresa's drumming, Ray's unique approach to sonic texture and electric guitars, sounds much different. Hope you like it.

I have always been thrilled to have Theresa on the team even though she moved out of town, making it harder for her to make the local gigs. I honestly doesn't think I would want to play live shows as The Charming Beards without Theresa. "I've been playing as an acoustic duo with Aaron McCurdy (bass, mandolin, vocals), but it wouldn't be the same without her. Playing on stage with Theresa Lazzari is a slice of heaven. We have an amazing chemistry on stage. She plays her heart out. She is great!

"I love this band. The Charming Beards aren't afraid to wander creatively for a bit. This EP was done with very few overdubs and essentially represents what you would hear if you came to one of our shows. We needed it to sound like that. These songs were written and then tested on our audience for over a year. Although we've been writing like crazy, these five songs are a staple in our setlist.

Katie started out doing a lot of solo gigs, and then she started filling in with a rock band and met a couple different people. Katie says this about that time in her career: "It started as my solo work and inviting people to play with me. I think the sound has changed from purer, folky stuff to more experimental and alternative influences."

Kelly recorded and released the solo album "Three Dark Days" in the fall of 2012.

I think the songs jump around a little bit, we have a hip-hop bit, a jamband-esqe 45-second homage to Bobby Light... but I feel the sound is cohesive. I like to believe that as long as the key elements of the band are present (Theresa, Ray, Aaron and myself) we will make sense.

My dad loves music and we always had music playing someplace in our house. My two brothers and I had obligatory piano lessons for years and I am so glad we did. My dad seemed to favor folk music. When he was in his twenties, he booked folk performers such as Chris Farrel and Ted Bird and Mike Prichard at a bar he owned. Boiangles. "I can remember as far back as three or four years old, and my favorite band was Peter Paul and Mary.

I still like that music but some of the names have changed for example I love Paul Simon's finger picking style, I love Ani DiFranco's percussive style," said Kelly. "As far as electric players go, I really like David Gilmour and Justin Mazer of Leroy Justice. (Mazer) is on my latest album. He would show me a couple things, and that heavily influenced my playing, which is cool because he's local, but he's dramatically changed my playing style.

We hope to do a hometown show soon to thank our dear friends who continually inspire and support us to pursue our art. In 2015 we will be recording a full-length album with Joe Loftus of JL Studios. We have been so fortunate to work with such talented engineers such as Joe Loftus and Mark Wohl (who recorded this EP).



We love listening to Katie but then again, we are her mom and dad.

NEPA musician Katie Kelly always seemed to be on a seemingly endless creative quest, and her perseverance eventually was noticed on a larger scale. She won a number of awards for her talent and

performances with one of her top achievements at the First ever Steamtown Music Awards for "Female Vocalist of the Year."

Kelly played with a number of bands over the years including her own "The Charming Beards: For a long time, she divided her time between the rock band Harlot, and a duo with musician Aaron McCurdy. Of course she devoted lots of time to her own band, The Charming Beards, a group all about that emotive expression that Katie so successfully channels through her music.

"We like to play music people can dance to or catch a case of the feelings," she offers of her varied projects.

Katie and her band The Charming Beards, released their debut EP on November 4, 2015. It was titled "Cigarettes and Whiskey" via Bandcamp. The EP, focuses on rockabilly rave-up to ambient. It comes two years after Katie herself released her debut solo album, "Three Dark Days." Even though her name was stamped to both releases, she says that the two albums are very different.

"Unlike the 'Cigarettes and Whiskey' EP, 'Three Dark Days' took about a year and a half to complete," she reveals. "This new EP was recorded in about 12 hours with an emphasis on our live sound."

Kelly says the new material with The Charming Beards was "road tested" for about a year, the songs being tightened through live performance. She indeed wanted the songs to paint an accurate picture of what the band sounds like live.

Kelly notes that though she wrote the foundations for the songs, her partners in The Charming Beards – guitarist Ray Novitski and drummer Theresa Lazarri (guest contributions come from Andrew McCurdy and Caitland Hawk on bass/vocals and Montana Delrango on melodica), each wrote their own parts and had a hand in the production and arranging. Katie was always the force that kept the group together.

Katie told me that she doesn't like telling people what to play because she wants everyone in the group to be themselves and add dimension to the songs."

Success comes from hard work

As far as the songs taking off, Katie spends a great deal of time practicing the guitar. It is a labor of love. She says the music will usually come first. She's the type of songwriter that when inspiration hits, she'll use whatever is handy to transcribe her muse – be it napkins, paper plates, or envelopes. When her dad put the musical pieces together for her lyrics in this book, he had a tough time putting all the napkin pieces together. He listened to the albums again to make sure of the words.

"Once I write a basic chord structure and lyrics, I bring it to the band," she tells those who ask. She credits "Ray, Theresa, and Aaron in coming up with their own parts and then the team starts working on the arrangements together. There is no in-box thinking because that is not unique. They all think outside the box and really make the songs come alive. They are a diverse group and the results of their work are also diverse. Then, it all merges together it's something completely different than the tune Katie says she'd been strumming on an acoustic guitar.

What the listener gets from hearing that music is up for interpretation. "I'm very open to listeners deriving their own meaning from what I've written," Kelly admits. "In fact, it would be very flattering, because in a way, my words and music have spoken to them personally."

Katie Kelly and The Charming Beards truly enjoy bringing their message to fans via the live stage.

"We are blessed to have great fans, friends, and we have a great musical community we like to think of as family," Katie says. "The NEPA music scene is so vibrant, diverse, and supportive; playing a show is one of the greatest experiences for me."

Save the date back when

The Steamtown Music Awards festival before it came into being, offered the folks a "save the date." Some said, "Finally, a save-the-date that doesn't come with the obligation of buying an over-priced gravy boat or something stupid like that."

So the message was for all to mark calendars for Thursday, September 17 and plan to bring nothing but unending support for favorite local musicians (and a debit card with enough money on it to turn up at the

bar). That's when the Steamtown Music Awards return for its second wind.

The awards may have just launched last year, but Steamtown's major event is already the most anticipated night for the body of talent in the local music scene. NEPA has a lot of great talent.

The gathering provides an opportunity for musicians to appreciate each other, said nominee Jay Preston of Esta Coda.

"Acknowledgement of our local music scene is important," he said. "The talent involved in it makes us all proud to be part of it."

In response to feedback, event co-founder Joe Caviston said this year's award ceremony separated and added categories to better reflect the current state of the NEPA music scene. Added categories include Radio Station, Music Journalist, Music Publication and Recording Studio of the Year. Split categories include DJ/Electronic Act and Americana/Jazz/Jam Act of the Year. They'll now serve as separate divisions.

The ClamStompers


In 2016 Katie Kelly formed a group with Aaron McCurdy called the ClamStompers. What are they all about?

The ClamStompers, comprised of Katie Kelly and Aaron McCurdy, put out their debut EP, Dwayne, on Jan. 16, 2016, but they came back a number of times since, releasing The Ballad of Mulder and Scully for those who appreciate science fiction X-files style, classic country and folk music, government conspiracies, or a strange combination of all those things.

While they were a team, this Wilkes-Barre duo highlighted their love of the X-Files. Just before the triumphant return of the long-running

TV series, Kelly & McCurdy caught up on their favorite episodes and Katie took the lead to write the song shortly thereafter

Recorded at JL Studios in Olyphant, the track follows the shows the main two characters and their many twists and turns. They have not played together in a few years but when they were at it, the ClamStompers masterful instrumentation and melodic voices, made for a heartbreaking bluegrass masterpiece.

They were graced by a press release from Hectic Management and Promotions, which sponsored the song. At the time, Katie assured that this would only be part one, with a closing track to be revealed once the new season ended. Music can be a lot of fun.

Chapter 9 More Katie Kelly Writeups Etc.

Katie: "Just look at this picture. It may look like work but for me it was pure fun. When I play with a band or with a duo, you can see the energy and the enjoyment on the players' faces. What a great field for me to enjoy. I call my own stuff outer-folk."

Wilkes-Barre singer/songwriter Katie Kelly plays 'outer-folk' music with passion and conviction



My family often sees me armed with a guitar and a t-shirt and one of my favorite shirts shows a cat in a spacesuit. I love Cats and dogs and having a few cats as family pets over the years helped me keep a major appreciation for the wiliness of the kitty cats in my life.

I love to share my musical talents with the friendly and captivated audience in front of me on the Camp Rattler stage in Pittston or at any event such as NEPAPALOOZA at Mountain Sky in Jermyn. Fun is music and music is fun.

My favorite part about music festivals is being able to go from stage to stage to hear different music, an opportunity many musicians take during a music fest. I expected the festival "to be a blast and a lot of fun," and it met my expectations 100%. All of the attendees "want to hear what's going on," and there is "a ton of camaraderie" in festivals such as NEPAPALOOZA.

Outer Folk

I describe my sound as "outer-folk," because I approach writing songs as one would put together a folk song, with just acoustic guitar and voice. Back when I was very active, I would finish a song and take it right away to my band, the Charming Beards, and this talented crew would inevitably add their own special things and change my creation around a bit, where it becomes something new and sometimes different. Of course I could always find myself in the resulting product.

"I love people putting their input into stuff that I've written." What a compliment. There is none better.

Growing up with music

We had a lot of music in our house growing up and it was not just the Ed Sullivan show reruns. I always wanted to play guitar, but my parents got me a piano teacher to go with our new piano. So, I was able to learn piano first. After six or seven years of piano, without too much fanfare, mom and dad finally allowed me to pick up the guitar. I bet they would have acceded sooner if I had pushed it.

I first played guitar in front of an audience at a high school talent show, and they liked me and they liked my music and my voice. I was thrilled and I have been performing ever since. Although I always get stage fright before each performance, I will never forget how nervous I was that first time.

"I don't think I have ever been more nervous in my life. I don't even know how I sounded on stage. Nonetheless, as I reminisce, the audience clapped loud and long. On stage, Kelly jokes about being awkward, and off stage, she mentions being nervous in interviews, but if you get to watch her in action, once she starts playing her music or even just talks about it, her awkwardness and nerves disappear and her passion takes over. Look at her in action and you can see it in her eyes.

Kelly clearly loves what she does, putting her all into her songs and performances, and her emotion is clear. Then she leaves it all on stage.

"I think when I'm not performing, I'm just kind of laid-back ... so playing the music is cathartic...I kind of build it up and then let it out on stage." What a life!

Nothing like Love Music

Whether the songs are deeply personal, like "Cigarettes and Whiskey," or are more distanced from my personal life, I have a lot of life experiences and I can draw the emotions that fit the song while I am performing on stage. I don't do as much of it in recent times, but I still get a gleam in my eye thinking of those days.

When I was writing regularly, I looked to folk musicians who were stars such as Bob Dylan, Joan Baez, and Peter, Paul and Mary for inspiration. I pull from my experiences, and while many of my songs are personal, "they're not revealing" about myself. I also draw from folklore and the stories of other people, which I fictionalizes as much as I can. It's fun to be someone else every now and then. One song I have is about an elderly couple who were each other's best friends, even after 45 years of marriage.

"That is the kind of love story I want to hear. I don't want to hear about whatever goes down in the club," I really mean that. That song only took about 10 minutes to write because of how much of an impact it had on me. While that one came easy, that isn't always the case.

Back in 2015, "I've been writing the same song for about a year and a half now. You get lucky sometimes and you just scribble it all down, and then other times, you get one line and you're done for four months. Maybe it is the color of the napkin or the scrap paper that brings the best songs out sooner. I don't know. But even when it doesn't flow immediately, the result is extremely enjoyable."

Music should not get you into trouble

One of my earlier tunes almost got me into some trouble. The person I wrote about was not too happy and he more than sorta resembled the remarks in the song. There was an implied threat to sue for libel, but everything I had said in the song was true, so there was no case. The song was about an incident in our high school involving a teacher and a student. Let me tell you I was enraged with what the school district had not done to prevent something like that from happening multiple times.

Even though this song has caused me some problems, while I was on the NEPA music scene, I did not stop playing it because "that kind of stuff happens over and over again" and it's a "pattern of people in authority shoving something like that under the rug to maintain appearances when it's something horrible."

I use my music sometimes to spread awareness because the situation that was my inspiration didn't make the news, and the only person who suffered was the victim. I do not want to see these things happening again and again, so I always try to do what I can to help matters.

In the 2014 to 2016 time period I had a lot in the works. I worked a lot with McCurdy. Our duo later was named the ClamStompers. We focuseed more on folk sounds with basic country structures. The Charming Beards were a heavier band that play my songs, but with different instrumentation, so with them, I was working on a concept album about the brain, but that was just in the beginning stages and has a long way to go. It is not ab active project anymore for the most part.

When I was at It all the time, my next Katie Kelly and the Charming Beards performance was to be live at the Summer Spotlight show at the F.M. Kirby Center in Wilkes-Barre on Friday, July 17 with comedians Dan Hoppel and Zack Hammond, spoken word artist The Carlton, musician Adam Bailey, lo-fi pop band Mock Sun, and poet Rich Howells, editor of NEPA Scene. Music is fun and fun still is music.

Katie Kellie and The Charmin Beards

When they were active, about seven years ago, Katie Kelly and The Charming Beards were an excellent band.

Out of the blue comes The Charming Beards

Every once in a while the crew had the good fortune of stumbling across an excellent band totally out of the blue. Katie Kelly and the Charming Beards is one of those cases for many NEPA pundit and music followers. for a lot of groups and regular people. People tell Katie how her music affects them. In this time period, for example, some folks had the chance to listen to the group's album Three Dark Days after randomly reading a newspaper clipping about one of their upcoming shows.

A listener made some comments: "I listened to the album simply because of the name of the band, and didn't have high expectations. I was pleasantly surprised to hear a beautifully haunting folk album. The lyrics are heart felt and deal with some very dark topics. It is clear that Katie Kelly pours her entire heart and soul into her music. I was blown away by the eerie melodies of music such as that shown in these lyrics:

Bless me Father and the lyrics are:

Mama always told I was her least favorite sin And if she had me to do over-Wouldn't do me over again

Well I know I have a father Sure, he ain't dead But he got more than he paid for when he left my mama's bed

Some Lind of Lover

Some Kind of Lover is another highlight of this album, less eerie, more uniquely refreshing and honest. Lyrics like this stand out compared to the meaningless platitudes of most new music today.

KATIE KELLY IS VERY PROUD TO HAVE BEEN PART OF NEPA MUSIC SCENE

Back in the 2015 era, The Charming Beards were making huge waves locally with their very original brand of electric folk rock. Katie Kelly and The Charming Beards would often grace venues such as the Highway 81 stage at Arts on the Square or other major events whenever she could. In recent years, Katie has gone underground somewhat and though she still surfaces every now an then, you can still buy her albums and play her music. Alexa, play Songs By Katie Kelly. Her recorded voice plays very well even though she is not as active as she was six years ago.

Some might say she is not into music anymore but if you lived in our house, you would know that is not true. But Katie is definitely no longer out there competing for music gigs in the NEPA scene and that is for sure. As her dad, I encourage her to continue with her music. Whether she gets active again is up to her but she left some great work for us to fill the voids and keep the hammer anvil and stirrups of our music ears well engaged in the meantime. .

Katie will tell you that she got her bands started after she had been performing her own original songs for a few years while working at JL Studios on a full-length album "Three Dark Days." While in the studio, Katie was able to arrange the songs without the constraints of them being a solo project.

In her own words, "I really didn't want the album to lack dimension, so I invited some of my favorite musicians to come into the studio and add their own parts to the tracks. There was nothing set in stone when they came in; their creativity and musicianship affirmed my belief that they'd interpret the tracks and have their own unique input.

People like Justin Mazer, Joe Loftus, Matthew Gabriel, Ray Novitski, Betty Harlot, Montana Delrango and Terry Childers came in with great ideas and gave me a taste of what it would be like to perform with a band rather than solo. It was a great experience and I grew from it as a musician and producer. I wanted to be part of a band, preferably a band that I could form.

Since the album was lush with instrumentation, I wanted to put on a show with a full band for the release party. Ray Novitski joined me one evening at The Rattler in Pittston almost eight years ago and has continued to be a part of the project until we wound it down a lot recently. Ray is one of the most innovative guitarists I've ever played with; his passion for making music is vast. He also plays with Terry Childers in an up-and-coming psychedelic band called OVA. Terry and I teamed up for some jamming just recently when he was in town.

While the bands were forming, playing any album-release party with a full band inspired me to form The Charming Beards. By chance, an old friend, Theresa Lazarri, who passed on too many years ago came into Guitar Center when I worked there to buy some guitar strings. I knew she was a great drummer, and I worked up the nerve to ask her to play with us, and she accepted.

I love both Theresa and Ray and consider it a great honor to play with them.

My dad says that the only thing you can do alone in life is fail. I thank God I was not alone. There were also a number of bands that have

influenced me and that list was growing and growing when I was most in need. Our bands kept developing our sound and we perfected it without it being perfect. When we pick up our tools again more regularly some day, who knows when. there are a lot of the parts on the road which we have yet to travel.

I will always have a soft spot for folk and the newer indie folk. I was obsessed with listening to Peter Paul and Mary on the record player as a child and they still give me the goosebumps. Folk music definitely has a huge impact on my songwriting, but I've been exposed to a much broader range of music that The Charming Beards have come to incorporate when fleshing out new material.

We all enjoy PJ Harvey, Ween, The Beach Boys, Explosions in the Sky and much more... especially oldies. Years ago, we decided to play all electric, and then we began to explore the sonic possibilities of effects pedals and such. Every day something good would happen as we all grew our talent.

Playing in NEPA, we've had plenty of opportunity to do shows with other bands from this area. We all love Hank and Cupcakes, Kaleigh Baker, Harlot, We Were Templars, Mock Sun, 3 to Breathe, A Social State, Keep Coming Back and many more. I loved it.


I am pretty sure that I can speak for the three of us when I say that we were all proud to be a part of such a diverse, vibrant and friendly music scene. We matched the vibes of the area with our music. There is a lot of great original music in our area. We're very fortunate to have venues and venue owners that supported us. Places like The Vintage Theater, The Factory: Underground, The Keys and The Other Side, and of course The Rattlet (just to name a few) give us the opportunity to play the music that we create.

I love going to a local show and seeing other local musicians in the audience cheering on the band that's on the bill that night.

I really can't complain about our local music scene to be honest. I know that there will be multiple great acts playing almost every night. The NEPA music scene and the musicians within always inspired me. I learned a lot from them.

As far as songwriting goes, I've definitely been influenced by a lot of things going on in this area. I fictionalize it a bit, but some are point blank – a true story. You'll never know.

I've written songs about known sex offenders working in our high schools, preying on young students without consequence. An older song "Wilkes-Barre" describes the tension about wanting to leave an economically depressed area, yet staying because your large Irish family lives here and mean more to you than anything else.







"Dream a Little Dream" is a 1931 song with music by Fabian Andre and Wilbur Schwandt and lyrics by Gus Kahn. It was first recorded in February 1931 by Ozzie Nelson and also by Wayne King and His Orchestra, with vocals by Ernie Birchill. A popular standard, it has seen more than 60 other versions recorded, with one of the highest chart ratings by The Mamas & The Papas in 1968 with Cass Elliot on lead vocals.

My daughter Katie as those of you who listen to her albums can attest, has a great voice and does a fine job of mimicking the Mama Cass version of the tune. Here are some facts I gleaned on the Internet about the Mamas and Papa's release

"Dream a Little Dream of Me" was recorded by the Mamas & the Papas in April 1968. Lead vocalist was Cass Elliott. Some say the group was ready to split up and there are several versions of the start and finish of the song on the album titled The Papas and the Mamas.

"Mama" Cass Elliot originally suggested to group leader John Phillips that the group record "Dream a Little Dream of Me". According to Phillips, despite getting the OK, Mama Cass was unhappy while recording the song.

Afterwards, she admitted that she tried to sing it like as if the year were 1943 and somebody had just come in and said, 'Here's a new song.'

I know I love the song and all of the renditions through the years. I think I got the oldest version of the song when I said to Alexa." Alexa, play Amazon Hits of the Forties." After a few songs a version came up by a male singer. Many greats have recorded this great song. Could the one I heard have been Ozzie Nelson's 1931 version. Ask me next time we meet. Cass Elliott and The Mamas and The Papas' 1968 recording of "Dream a Little Dream of Me" sold nearly seven million copies almost 40 years after the music was composed by two relatively unknown musicians, Fabian Andre and Wilber Schwandt.

Here's some stuff captured by Wikipedia. Very interesting:

In the album version, recorded with the Mamas and the Papas, a spoken introduction from an engineer is heard mentioning a drink, and then concluding with the words: "And now, to sing this lovely ballad, here is Mama Cass". Only the last part was heard on the single version of the song. Cass did her own whistling, which is heard before the song's fade.

In the UK, "Dream a Little Dream of Me" reached #11 that September; the track also afforded Mama Cass a hit in Ireland (#13) and South Africa (#8).

In Australia the Go-Set Top 40 chart ranked "Dream a Little Dream of Me" at #1 for the weeks of 4 & 11 September 1968.

"Dream a Little Dream" was released as a single in Europe in 1992 - credited to the Mamas and the Papas and featuring that group's #1 hit "Monday, Monday" as the B-side.

It reached #5 in Germany and #22 in Switzerland. In Australia the song spent two weeks at #1, and was the 16th biggest hit of 1968.

A slightly different version of "Dream a Little Dream of Me" was included on Elliot's solo debut album, Dream a Little Dream. Cass & company sold seven million copies of the song. It became her

signature. First time I hear Katie singing it, I thought it was Mama Cass. Nice job Katie
