When Brian Jr. had enough swimming and really needed the break, he would let Alexa unguarded. Then, when he would come back from taking his break, he would find the song Mr. Bojangles filling the back patio airwaves. I think he liked it, but Madonna was #1 for my son.

Before Brian took back control of the DOT, I would ask Alexa to play some Al Jolson, Roy Orbison, the Beatles, and the list goes on. Brian was swimming so he did not mind. I had no idea how to set up the Alexa for playing outdoors so once Brian left for the day, I was out of music luck until he came back another day and set it up again.

Eventually, I watched him set it up. Think of this. He unplugged the electrical cord from where my daughter kept Alexa inside and he plugged it in outside by the pool and placed it on a table. I waited to see which buttons he pushed and was very surprised that he pushed none. He immediately commanded "Alexa, play Madonna!" Alexa obediently played Madonna songs while I waited for his first break.

After Brian left for home that Sunday, I decided to try it myself the following Monday. It was a bright and sunny August day and I plugged Alexa in outside. I saw the lights flicker and when they stopped, I said, Alexa, play Mr. Bojangles. Alexa said playing Mr. Bojangles by the Nitty Gritty Band and then she played the song.

It wasn't loud enough so I said, *louder*. I had no idea it would work. Alexa has ten volume settings from level 1 to 10. I could have said Alexa, set volume to 5 and it would have set the volume at the halfway mark. She listened to me and the volume got stronger. When the song finished, I said, "Again!" and Alexa played *Mr. Bojangles* for me again. I had mastered Alexa for all I needed—music. It did not take much.

I had thought the DOT was my daughter Katie's. It was not. It was the second generation Echo Dot that I bought to control her iRobot. It was a Christmas gift about two or three years ago. That was all any of us knew about Alexa. It produced nice music but it was small and did not give the best sound—but not too bad. It was an Alexa 2.

The more I tuned into this marvelous little machine, the more I wanted to get one but I wanted it to played a little better sound. At the time, the DOT was on Generation III and now it is on Genration IV with even better sound.

I knew none of this in August so I asked my adult kids if Amazon had other units. They told me yes, and I found them on the Internet. At the time, a taller device known as the Alexa 3rd Generation was available. At the same time, there was also an Alexa II Plus that claimed to have third generation sound technology plus it has two other facilities not implemented on the Alexa III. Sometimes I call the unit the Alexa and sometimes I call it the Echo. It is actually the Echo with the Alexa brain.

So, the Echo 2 has sound quality like an Echo 3 but it also has a built-in smarthome hub and a temperature sensor which the Echo III lacks. I paid the extra twenty bucks for the II Plus. I love it but I have not needed its extra facilities.

My daughter set it up for me. I figured though I was a computer geek, small units were not my specialty.

Nonetheless, I was so thrilled with my own Echo II plus for about \$79 that I wanted to share my experience with four family members. That's how much I love them. I went out to the Internet to see how much the Echo II Plus cost after I had mine for a month. I was surprised at all the differences. First of all the unit known as Echo II Plus was discontinued but at the time it was still available on Amazon specials, which were easy to find.

Just a month after I bought the Echo II Plus, the Echo IV Gen had been announced along with new 4 Gen DOTS that were shaped differently—not like the high towered hockey puck look. I kept looking and I found the Echo II Plus at a closeout price of \$59.00. I had paid \$79.00 The Echo 4 Gen was \$99.00. I was very happy with my II Plus so I bought four of them for family and friends.

Of the four units that arrived in less than two days, my sons Brian and Mike set their own up with no assistance almost immediately. My uncle Gerry still has not set his up four months after receiving the gift. My sister Nancy invited my brother Joe and sister Mary and I and our spouses to her home for breakfast a while later. I delivered her Echo Plus in its new box. She was tickled.

While I was there I finally took the plunge into Echo technology and I read about how to set it up. For a guy who solved problems for the IBM Corporation for a living for 23+ years, I realize now that I put it off too long. It was easy. E-Z! It was so easy that before our breakfast, I set up my sister Nancy's Alexa. It was my first time.

The toughest part was figuring out her iPhone password. Once we got that, we downloaded and set up the Alexa software (app) on her iphone. That was necessary to get the Alexa working. We followed the several instructions in the teeny Alexa manual and before we knew it, my sister's Alexa was pounding out great philharmonic music just like mine. She and I were thrilled but for different reasons. I had become capable of installing Alexa and she now had her very own working Alexa which gave what seemed to be a philharmonic quality sound. "Mr. Bojangles, remastered by the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band on Amazon Music." The next sounds would come from the song:

I knew a man Bojangles and he danced for you In worn out shoes

Silver hair, a ragged shirt and baggy pants The old soft shoe

This great song is one of my all-time favorites. When I was just over 21-years of age, I jointly owned a bar in Parsons, PA, just outside of Wilkes-Barre with my recently RIP buddy George Mohanco. We liked the theme of the Bojangles song so much that we named our new bar "Mr. Bojangles."

Such a great experience and the song brings back all those great memories. The Echo II Plus with Alexa sound makes it sound to me like Mr. Bojangles is tapdancing to a philharmonic. Your first Alexa experience is no less than daunting.



Play Mr. Bojangles, please

There was no Alexa back in the 1970's. But, the corner Wurlitzer, A hot coin-operated jukebox, served as the partially automated music-playing machine. It was a coinactivated voice-activated unit. Everybody knew how to operate it. You needed first a dime, then as time went on, you needed a quarter—unless you owned the bar. Then, you could set it to "FREE."

The coin woke up the Juke Box and played our patron's selection from self-contained media recorded on 45rpm records. Our jukebox had buttons, with letters and numbers on them, which, when one of each group were entered after each other, it selected a specific record. In our case, the most played song was Mr. Bojangles.

Today the most played voice activated song on my Echo II Plus is Mr. Bojangles. Sounded great then. Sounds even better today. Even better than a Wurlitzer. No kidding!

I first met Alexa at the family Christmas gathering at my nephew Scott's home in Harrisburg in 2016. My sister-in-law Sue brought an Echo Dot as her donated prize for a Dirty Bingo game. She said she had gotten a great deal with the unit costing her about \$20.00. Some of the family thought she paid more, which violated the Dirty Bingo rules. But that's Sue—generous to a fault. I had no idea what it was or what it could do.

I think my brother-in-law Marty got final possession of the Echo Dot at the end of the Dirty Bingo game. I never saw him use it but I am sure he loves it like I love mine. Nobody knew what the Amazon Echo Dot was at first but everybody seemed interested.

In short while, the Internet had explained all. I recall that no member of our high tech family made Alexa wake up and by the end of the night, to me and others, it was still a mystery. But, we had seen it and felt it. .

Some had seen things like the Echo Dot with Alexa or with strange names like Seri before. Not me! I had no idea what they were. I was an old fart who liked wine. Worse than that; I did not even care.

My nephew Scott had some fine libations at the event to which I was preoccupied. I am not even sure I was in the Dirty Bingo game. I had a nice stool in the open kitchen. But I do recall seeing this thing that looked like an attractive grey hockey-puck. It was Amazon's first real Echo device known as the Dot.

A year or so later, ahem, as usual, I reached deep into my wallet for my wife's Christmas present. As part of a bundle for her iRobot, was an Amazon Echo Dot. It happened to be an Echo II in its early stages.

I still did not understand what it was all about. My brother Joe set it all up for my wife so that it would respond to the name Brian W (as the cleaner upper). I was still oblivious. When Pat finally began to use her new vacuum, I heard her say *Brian W* Start. I now understand. c

It was not until this summer that I became interested again in Alexa. Alexa, start the next chapter. Oh, never mind kiddo, I'll do that.

Chapter 2 From Amazon with Love?

Before you consider buying this great product, I must remind you that the Amazon Echo is one of the most strategically planned products ever from Amazon and it is still in its infancy. Echo is the hardware and Alexa is the controlling brain. Amazon boasts of over 5000 developers and engineers working on this product to make it better, better, better. ah! I am happy just using its voice recognition and musical connections and right now, at least, my personal Echo-lust goes no further.

It turns out the idea of the Echo had been kicked around in the Amazon Labs from 2011 when it was viewed by the company as one of the promises upon which to bet for the future. The company's founder Jeff Bezos was very interested in the project and so it was one of those things that had little problem receiving organizational funding and support. The Amazon company was not about to fail its boss.

The original goals for the Echo was for it to become "an intelligent, voice-controlled household appliance that could play music, read the news aloud and order groceries—all by simply letting users talk to it from anywhere in the house." Amazingly from where I stand, Amazon achieved its goal and now it is on to continual improvements as in 1.2, 2.0, 2.1, 3.0, 4.0, etc.

The revisions and enhancements are coming out just like DOS and Windows from the 1980's. A higher version or generation number always means a better mousetrap.

Alexa "the voice enabler," aka, the digital assistant, was first launched on the Amazon Echo in November 2014. The Echo at the time was a small piece of hardware shaped like a hockey puck. It was known as the Echo Dot. Alexa came with it. The combination was initially only available to invited Amazon Prime members. General release for the Echo and Alexa was June 2015. Just a little more than five years ago.

Echo is a small machine in a class of devices and voices known as digital assistants. Before digital assistants could ever be invented, however, PC-like machines and chips had to be able to be made to understand the human voice. This phenomenon is known as *voice recognition*. It is not just recording the voice but recognizing the messages that the voice contains.

The capability that gives a machine the ability to speak is called *voice synthesis*. Voice recognition is much more difficult than voice synthesis. Alexa, the "brain" of the Amazon Echo line of machines performs both voice recognition and voice synthesis.

IBM and other technology research firms were leaders in the difficult task of voice recognition. In August 1981, IBM invented The IBM Personal Computer (PC) and from there the digital revolution using the word "personal" began. The primary device used to "talk" to PCs in the 1980's was the keyboard and then the mouse and then an array of other input and combination output/input devices.

Human speech was very difficult for computers to learn to understand and so it eluded researchers in the 1980s but incremental gains and inventions continued to be made. In the 1990s digital speech recognition technology was perfected and it became a feature of the personal computer.

IBM, Philips, and Lemout & Hauspie in the early research days were fighting for speech recognition customers. A few years later, IBM launched the first smartphone known as IBM Simon in 1994. This laid the foundation for smart virtual digital assistants as we know them today.

According to industry analysts twenty years ago, speech recognition technology was one of top technology trends to watch for the next two to five years. "Speech recognition will drive innovation in user interfaces over the next decade. "The Philips-IBM strategic relationship accelerated market growth and made it easier to launch truly international products," according to William Meisel, President, TMA Associates, a speech industry consulting firm."

The Echo with Alexa and all the other personal digital assistants of today are the beneficiaries of all this advanced research. Alexa, "say it is so."

The experts see digital assistants as being the next revolution in computing. We all believe it because we have begun to see it happen. iPhones have Siri; Google has its Assistant, Microsoft has Cortana, and of course Alexa is all Amazon's. These technologies can get you results with nothing but a voice command. You can stay in your E-Z Chair and bark your commands.

Alexa, has clearly dominated the digital assistant market space in the past few years. I know because I even know about it. It has quickly become a household name. My sister now listens to Patsy Cline in her quiet moments and she does not even need a remote.

Amazon established an early foothold in the war for digital assistant supremacy, but for those who don't use Alexa or one of its competitors, there's still the question of what exactly they are. When we answer by answering the question of what is Alexa, we will also have answered the question of what is a digital assistant.

Chapter 3 What is Alexa?

The Amazon Echo listens to you, translating your voice into commands so it can play music, turn the lights on, or order stuff from Amazon. ... Amazon calls the built-in brains of this device "Alexa," and she* is the thing that makes it work.

Digital Trends offers this answer:

Alexa is Amazon's all-knowing, interactive voice assistant. Available on Amazon's lineup of Echo speakers, smart thermostats, soundbars, lamps and lights, and right on your phone through the Alexa app, Alexa can do quick math for you, launch your favorite playlists, check news and weather, and control many of your home's smart products.

It is all that folks and more! It's Special!

For this book, we concentrate on describing Alexa and the Echo product and of course, we show the user how to make the most of the product's music facilities. But, like above, we also give a few revealing tid-bits of other capabilities of these fascinating Amazon devices.

With Alexa having turned six-years old in 2020, going on seven in 2021, the kindergarten-aged "platform" with Alexa in control is destined to teach the rest of the tech world and more than likely the rest of the education industry. Before we know it, perhaps Alexa will be your school text book. Just saying—perhaps.

FYI, you can also read my kindle books or anybody else's online without the kindle reader hardware shown above. You don't even need Alexa. You can use the Kindle cloud reader which is a web app developed by Amazon for reading with any web browser (Google Chrome, Internet Explorer, Safari and Firefox). It enables you to read Kindle books without downloading any app.

Alexa is clearly ubiquitous. It is everywhere like Johnny Cash once was. Many homes have more than one. Some homes have lots more than one. Some have an Amazon Alexa device in every room in their house and two or three in certain rooms.

If you want to keep in touch with all of your Amazon devices, it is getting easier and easier with Alexa. You can integrate Echo's with Amazon's Fire TV devices, the Kindle I am writing this book in early January November 2020. I wrote a book titled Hey Alexa in November, and this book is all that and more. Alexa is not a newborn but each version is like a new species. It was just six years ago, on Nov. 6, 2014 that Amazon announced the original Echo speaker. At that time, the unit cost \$199 (or \$99 for Amazon Prime members). This was the "launch" price.

We already discussed how this "smart speaker" was originally available by invitation only, for the first few months. The test versions were out for over a year, when it seemed that all at once, regular consumers were enabled to buy an Echo. Just this week my last order for Echo products came in at \$18.99 each (The Dot 3rd Gen). I still don't know what I am going to do with them all but I'll bet you now it is not the last Echo I buy.

My sister-in-law Sue, swears she got an Echo Dot with Alexa for \$19.99 at least three years ago in time for Dirty Bingo. Maybe! Nonetheless, the public bought them up like candy bars as soon as they became available.

The Dot is the price-performer for sure. In 2019 Amazon said it had sold more than 100 million Alexa-compatible devices. I would expect that number to be approaching 1 billion today. That's how ubiquitous Alexa has become. Alexa devices fit into a new category which doesn't come along in consumer electronics very often.

Amazon had a lot to overcome to be successful with Alexa. The major obstacle was that Amazon per se, was not known

as a hardware company. The company achieved success as a mass distributor of products made by others. Its prior Fire Phone effort was a complete flop and so failure was another option that Amazon's new venture had to overcome. Its prior failure perhaps assured its current success. Think about that.

Since the Fire phone and the Echo speaker were developed at about the same time by Amazon's "Lab126," it was clear that the company was willing to use its other vast resources to take risks to see which innovations would connect with customers. Alexa and the Echo units made it big-time. There is no need for second guessing this tremendous success.

Use what ya got on the shelf

One of the ways that Amazon was able to speed things to market with less potential failures was to use standard available parts when possible rather than inventing it all internally.

Amazon also decided to make it easy for other developers to plug their apps into Alexa's code, and to plug Alexa's code into all kinds of third party apps and devices. That is why the Echo with Alexa was able to catch on so quickly. Amazon's Alexa is an open platform, being able to connect to mostly everything means it is "open."

Other developers have been out in the marketplace busily making their units work with Alexa. They figure when Alexa is successful—now—they will also enjoy some of that success. Each time a developer builds another capability, Amazon considers it another Alexa "skill." Today, there are well over 100,000 skills, besides music, my favorite.

The skills allow Alexa users to play word games, hear jokes, access their calendars, translate from one language to another, and more. And on the hardware side, Amazon itself has rolled out a massive array of Alexa-compatible devices—everything from televisions and thermostats to headphones, microwave ovens, and other clever implementations of voice-enabled technology.

Partnerships with outside developers have brought the Alexa "brain" and sound to popular products. Perhaps you have seen such brands as Fitbit smartwatches and Sonos high-end speakers. If not, watch out!

Alexa can now come with your new GM vehicle and can even be retrofitted into older models. It can do everything in your car that you would do with it at home. Drivers can control the lights or climate and even add items to their Amazon shopping cart. You know now! Therefore, don't be shy about ordering toilet paper on the go for the go. Since fingers are not required, maybe the Charmin Bears can also make a nice TP order so they can stay clean.

Amazon plans to extend its openness even further. The executives are saying that they are willing to share their platform with other digital assistants. "The whole pie is getting bigger as customers are embracing this technology," Tom Taylor, who heads the Alexa effort, boasted to Fortune. "As we look at the future of these voice assistants, we don't think that you just have one any more than you would just have one friend." At \$18 bucks a piece for a Dot 3 Gen on Black Friday 2020, Amazon put its money where its Alexa mouth is.

Of course if you have no Echo today, one is a good enough start. Alexa can be controlling your music within ten minutes out of the box and the music will melt your heart.

Over time, Alexa has also grown more complex and more capable. Smart home control wasn't even foreseen as a possible use case by Amazon engineers initially. Now, besides music, my favorite and my reason for writing this book, it has become one of the most popular functions.

Drivers buzzing by cities now see more light action than ever with users controlling household lights by voice and inside, they control the thermostats, and many other items. It is easy but let's get you listening to your favorite tunes first.

I have a young uncle Gerry who has had his \$59.00 Alexa II Plus for almost four months now and he has not taken it out of the box yet. He knows like every other new Alexa user, to begin his installation and set-up, he needs to download the Alexa App to his cell phone. He is stuck right there.

He confessed to one of my other buddies, Denny Bucko that he does not want to be spied on by Amazon. Denny does not think Gerry will ever get his Alexa going because he is afraid of "Big Amazon." We'll see!

There was a time when there was a need for privacy concerns and perhaps there still is a little. It was widely reported that a Geekwire reviewer highlighted that Alexa users did not completely understand that their computers (Echo) had given access to their data and recordings that had been collected and shared—even just within Amazon.

After a few minor incidents, like police officers seeking Alexa recordings, in one case to investigate a murder, the privacy issue had to be addressed by Amazon this year.

Reporters discovered that there were thousands of people who worked for Amazon, listening to a small portion of Alexa customer recordings for good reason—in order to improve the system's voice recognition and other features.

Some critics charged that Amazon hadn't been clear that its employees could listen to customer recordings.

The Amazon Executive in charge said "We thought we were telling customers clearly and we thought it was a pretty known industry thing." Humans had been reviewing users' dictation recordings and map requests and other data collected by their devices.

Regular people were in the loop on all these things. The company thought it had been communicating its concerns and solutions well enough. But, with the recent blowback, even Amazon learned it had not done enough to alleviate the public fears. That was yesterday and yesterday's gone.

As a result of the findings, Amazon addressed the issues with vigor. The company improved its policies on disclosure and customer control. For example, users can now opt out completely of having their recordings reviewed by other humans.

Users can also review and delete their recordings. One can certainly give Amazon credit for making it much better than when nobody saw collecting data as a problem. Maybe my buddy Gerry will start listening to music one day soon.

By the way, my uncle, Gerry Rodski plays often with a great local "older rock" group known as The Music Room from NEPA. He is a pro and has a massive guitar selection. If Amazon can convince Uncle Gerry they are safe, he is a reasonable man and will surely support their efforts. Come on Ger!

If Alexa was not so unique and so powerful a device, it would not be so pervasive. As we have been discussing, Alexa, of course, is Amazon's very capable artificially intelligent assistant. It first appeared in the Echo "smart" speaker. She has this always-listening microphone array, and she has the means to respond to your voice commands and execute your requests.

If you do not ask nicely, in other words if you are rude, sarcastic or vulgar, Alexa is trained to give you the short shrift. Ask nicely and you can stream something to your stereo; watch something on TV, check the news, traffic, and weather reports, order a pizza, and, not surprisingly, you can buy stuff from Amazon.

With 3,000 recognizable commands at last count, and with the count growing every day, the "voice lady" is probably about 2,995 words more conversant than your neighbor's dog. After all, the neighbor's dog never seems to be listening to reason. Alexa listens to everything.

Independent experts believe that soon, everything will have an Alexa (or Siri, Cortana, or Google Assistant) patiently listening as an electronic servant. And admittedly, having a voice assistant hovering ubiquitously as a supplicant minion, it may create out of our once capable bodies, the need for a

"Graham," the creepy crash guy shown below. Remember him?



Graham – not a real person but an amalgam of what not using your body parts will bring.

One of my worst fears is that using just voice commands rather than arms and legs and hands and feet, after a while, thanks to Alexa, we might all evolve to look something like Graham—above. Whatever we need, we'll just ask, and Alexa will provide.

"Our heads will grow big and neckless because we'll never need to take our eyes off our big screens. Our bellies will grow fat because we'll never need to leave our La-Z-Boys. Our arms will be skinny because of lack of use and mostly wither away because we won't even have to pick up the remote.

Am I telling the truth? Well, let's try it with music. Suppose you wanted to hear "I Should Have Known Better" In the old days, you had to walk over to your record shelf, find your Beatles Albums, then, A Hard Day's Night, then play it on the stereo, and move the needle to the second song on side A.

Now, in the electronics age, you just press a few buttons on your browser or phone. With Alexa and her friends, it is even easier. You won't even need to move your fingers. No phone or keyboard necessary either. Just sit there! Ask Alexa. She will be happy to help you, even if your name is not yet Graham. Alexa, play "I should have known better, by the Beatles.

Or if you want to play an album that happens to have the same name as a song on the album you can say, "Alexa, please play the Beatles Album, *Please Please Me*." If you don't tell Alexa it is an album, it will play the great Beatles song, "*Please Please Me*"

Chapter 4 Tell Me More about Alexa and Amazon's Echo Devices.



Everybody knows who and what Amazon is all about. For many, Amazon had represented their first online book purchase and now almost anything else in the online purchasing category. The company surely seems to know what it is doing.

Amazon became the most valuable public company in the world after passing Microsoft. Then, Apple passed Amazon. Last time I checked, Amazon was the # 2 American company by market cap (total value of shares)—not too shabby!

It is quickly approaching the \$2 trillion benchmark. The company has many achievements. Making the Echo and inventing Alexa are only part of their story. You can read lots about Amazon if you like. For our purposes, know that they can afford to make as many Echos with Alexa as the people want each year. This Amazon product will be

smarter and provide even more for the purchaser's dollar as time rolls by.

The picture below is as Lewis and Clark would say—is of a pioneer—an Amazon pioneer—the Echo 2. I have had one at home for over two years. It came with my wife's iRobot. As great a product as the Echo Dot 2 is, Amazon is not alone in the race of high tech voice-enabled devices. Amazon may not be the only game in town anymore but the company is clearly #1 in the race.



The Amazon Echo Dot 2

Alexa as we have discussed briefly in this book, is the voice assistant on Amazon devices. It is equivalent to Apple's Siri, Microsoft's Cortana, and Google's Google Assistant. Siri is second in popularity to Alexa and is available across most of Apple's devices, including iPhone, iPad, Mac, Apple Watch, Apple TV, and the HomePod.

Amazon has more competitors every day, but the Echo line is more than holding its own. Some other biggies include Google's Assistant and its NEST, Samsung's Bixby, Apple's Homepod, and Microsoft's Cortana. They are all in the same market territory with their own special units. Amazon is the company bringing in over 60% of the bacon.

This book focuses on the music facilities and commands in Amazon's Echo series with Alexa. However, it's you, who have to decide which Echo hardware unit is best to serve as your personal "smart speaker" with artificial intelligence abilities. Alexa, the cute indescribable *Echo Brain* would be happy to host any of your Amazon devices. Alexa can also control home units through smartplugs and smart thermostats etc.

This book is mostly about using your Echo for music. Once you master music, the entire world of Alexa is your oyster. There are other more sophisticated Amazon devices that you can use as your intelligent speakers but once we show you how to master the Echo, if you choose to up your device ante, it will all come easier.

We talk about music in this book but as noted, there is a whole other world available for Alexa-enabled products. Remember unknowingly Brian W (my name and the iRobot's name) became Alexa's name to operate my wife's iRobot. My brother set it up that way as a joke. Now, I know enough to set Alexa up myself.

Which brand will you say fulfils your needs the best? I made up my mind reading the available research and of course the great ads for the various units on the Internet. After checking out many smart speakers and doing light research about each of the main players in this space, my opinion is that Alexa as an idea and a realization is ahead of all its competitors. The Echo is all you need to get going in this new personal digital assistant world. It's what you find in all of your friend's home's today.

Amazon Echo in all its generations is quite a device. It is a hybrid speaker that not only broadcasts sound, it understands voices. Its voice recognition will answer your questions and can manage a number of particular tasks. We'll discuss how to set it up soon and then we'll show you how to bring the Alexa philharmonic music sounds into any room of your home.

In the next chapter we lightly discuss the Echo models that Amazon provides. Just about all of the models, even those that are not the most current are still available from various sources. The Internet is the best place to do your Alexa shopping.

Chapter 5 How to Buy Your Own Amazon Echo with Alexa.



More than likely, you bought this book to help you understand all of the musical treats that would come your way with your very own Alexa. You may not have your Alexa yet, or like Uncle Gerry it is still in its box. For those of you in the former category this chapter will tell you where

Amazon's Echo can be found. You will learn what models are out there and which are available for you to bring home as your own.

The Amazon Echo itself was first dreamed up in 2011 and soon, about ten years ago it blossomed into a project known internally as "Project D."

Where there is a "D", most often there is an "A." FYI, Project A was the development of *Kindle* and Project B was the *Fire Phone*. The Echo came about from the work on Project C though whatever Project C was intended to be, it was never completed. The Echo was a major fruit of that particular project.

Amazon's Echo thus came from the remains of a defunct project. It was supposed to be named the Amazon *Flash*. But the Flash never saw the light of day.

Amazon's Lab 126 in Amazon was responsible for the work with the project. Let's take a side trail for a bit here to discuss one of the decisions about the Echo project. If you have not heard of such a term yet as a "wake word." This next paragraph will "wake you up" to the word.

There is this notion called the "wake word," which as they say is the word that makes a device responsive to voice commands. It is a word that wakes up the device so that it listens to commands. The default wake word for the Echo is now *Alexa*. Say Alexa when your unit is set up and you'll know exactly what I mean.

When you want the unit to do something such as play your favorite music, you say the wake word, Alexa, and the

Alexa then begins to listen to your commands to her. Well, it was not always so easy when there was a dispute over the wake word in the Amazon Lab.

You see, there were those who wanted the wake word to be Amazon. Amazon's Development Lab 126 did not like the word Amazon as a wake word. This is important because Lab126 is an important division in the company that performs the research and development and then creates the computer hardware for the Echo device.

"Amazon" was perceived by this group to be a too commonly used word, and they were concerned that their device would react and wake up too often--when it was not intended to. For example, the speakers would wake upon hearing Amazon ads on television and begin buying random stuff from the Internet. This seems like it would help business but surely not for long.

The boss, Jeff Bezos, who is the founder and CEO of Amazon, made the decision in favor of the Lab 126 engineers. The company then changed the name of the hardware to the Amazon Echo and the wake-up word to "Alexa". Now you know the rest of the story and you can win at your next trivia game.

Here are some additional trivia secrets for your next victory party. Despite Alexa being the default, the Echo now permits the user to change the wake word. You can't change Alexa's name as imprinted on your Amazon speaker, but you can change your speaker's "wake word" to one of several other available terms.

As noted, the Amazon speakers are set to listen for the name "Alexa" as its default "wake word, but you can change it to either "Amazon," "Echo," or "computer." Neat, right? If you have two Alexa's close by and they do different things, it might be wise to call one of them "Echo" instead of Alexa.

The process is easy but many users get their smart phone out and use the default "wake word." A new word can be changed remotely via the app, or directly through your device speaker.

Some more trivia is that The Amazon Echo was originally intended only to become a smart speaker. It was not originally supposed to be a smart home hub, as it is now. That did not happen until the first echo hit the market.

As *Alexa*, the brain, aka, the artificial intelligence (A.I.) that powers the Amazon Echo, kept improving, the unit became more of a controlling center for smart home appliances.

Before the public appeared reluctant to buy smart home appliances, computer developers could not wait to make their devices compatible with Alexa. In fact, the chief Amazon developer who was also the evangelist for Echo and Alexa, Dave Isbitski, received calls from smart home manufacturers to discuss connecting their devices, after the initial release of the Amazon Echo.

The only problem as noted was that people were not buying them because in the early days of smart homes, they were often disappointing. The current vision for the Echo has been enhanced for it to be more of the controlling hub of a smart home. Everything keeps improving. Despite not initially meeting its intended first market, the 1st Generation Amazon Echo was released in March 2014 for Amazon Prime. More trivia is that the voice of Alexa was inspired by the systems in both the television series Star Trek: The Original Series and Star Trek: The Next Generation.

In March 2016 Amazon released a byproduct of the Amazon Echo, which brought the device into what we recognize today as the Amazon Echo Dot. This unit is the hockey puck sized version of the original Amazon Echo with the same capabilities. It was put together to be used in smaller rooms such as bedrooms and it can be paired with an external speaker for sound amplification.

Eight months later in November 2016 version 2.0 was released as the second generation of the Echo Dot. It had a much lower price with highly tuned voice recognition and attractive new colors new colors.

This is not a tech book so we are not providing much more than the origin of the product and its basic specifications and capabilities so you have a decent perspective. There is a lot to know because every day Amazon has 5000 or more developers working on improvements to the various models of the Echo device

The specifications of the current models and the price ranges that regular people pay today come right from Amazon on the Internet. We thank Amazon for telling us all we need to know. The Echo product begins on the following page.

The second generation of the Amazon Echo was released in October 2017. This update offered better voice recognition and a fabric covering exterior. Since this many other variants of the Amazon Echo have been released.

In May 2017 Amazon released the now-discontinued Amazon Tap, a portable, slightly smaller version of the Amazon Echo. Although the two products are similar the Tap is battery powered, portable, and requires the touch of a button in order to enable voice commands.

In April 2017 the Amazon Echo Look was released to invitees only, as an Amazon Echo with a built in camera. It was designed as a speaker, that is also handy with artificial intelligence that has smart algorithms to help you pick out outfits. It was released to the general public in August 2018.

In June 2018 the Amazon Echo Show was released to the public as a device with a 7-inch screen used for streaming media, making video calls, and the use of Alexa. The second generation of the device was made available in November 2018 and features a 10-inch screen with improved speakers.

Your Amazon Echo is there to help when it comes to setting up your preferred music streaming service and setting reminders. However, it doesn't tell you the best and safest areas in your house to place the smart speaker.

Are you now thinking, "Does it really matter where I put it as long as I can speak to Alexa from most areas in my house?" Amazon's answer is yes.

Placing your Alexa device in certain areas of your house could risk your privacy, security or even damage your Echo.

For example, did you know intruders can access your smart speaker from outside if it's placed too close to a window?

We're here to tell you where you shouldn't place your Echo speaker and the best spots for it. Check the Internet or ask your Alexa for more information.

One day out of the blue Mike Grant told me he loves Alexa. He told me that he was having an affair with his personal digital assistant. He has written a brief essay about his unclassic love affair. He agreed to let me share it with you all.

Rather than explain Alexa's music capabilities like a classroom lecture, why don't I just show you what Mike has to say about Alexa and how he "risked his marriage," to continue his affair with Alexa. Eventually, he and his wife Mo made it all work with a musical threesome:

Really Nice Essay!

My first use of Alexa in the house was starting my wife's iRobot.

My brother had enabled the iRobot Alexa skill and signed in with my wife's iRobot® account to link her iRobot with Alexa. He had to first create an iRobot® account and then register the robot in the iRobot Home App.

I was able to use iRobot commands to control my Wife Pat's iRobot in our home. After my brother named the iRobot Brian W, it was easy. After alerting Alexa and saying Alexa, start Brian W., the device would start vacuuming. I could

also say start, stop, pause, locate or I could send Brian W back to its charging station for more juice.

OK, now that I got that out of the way, here is how I use my Echo II Plus every night. In the summer I kept the device outside when it was not raining and now that it is cold, I keep it on the bar in my sunroom.

On my way to the bar, I say Alexa, play Mr. Bojangles.. You know what happens.

After hearing Mr. Bojangles I am now ready to explore more music.

But since it was just the Christmas season, I would say, "Alexa, Give me some gift ideas under a hundred dollars.

After listening for ideas for awhile, I would say, "Alexa, Stop."

To get in the Christmas mood, I would say Alexa, play Christmas songs. Obediently Alexa would oblige. If it is not loud enough or not soft enough I might say

Alexa, Louder—repeat until volume is right Alexa, Lower—repeat until volume is right

I could do the same for Easter or Thanksgiving or New Years Eve or other holidays for which Alexa has a built-in playlist. I can create a playlist which I will tell you how to do in the next chapter.

I can say, Alexa, play Guy Lombardo

I can say Alexa, play *Enjoy Yourself* by Guy Lombardo or I can say Alexa, play *Auld Lange Syn* by Guy Lombardo I Or I can say Alexa, play *New Year's Eve* by Guy Lombardo.

When I have heard enough and want to change my selection, I can say it while it is playing but I often say Alexa, stop and then give the next command.

Here are some other tunes / songs I can get Alexa to play just by sounding the wake word, Alexa first and then giving the play command followed by something like the following:

Alexa, play the Best of the 1950's. Stop Continue

With Continue Alexa begins to play the stopped song at the stop point. It remembers.

Since Best of the 50's would play one song after another, I might like to know the name of the artist. Guess How?

Alexa, What is the name of this Artist. It is that easy.

Here are some other great songs/albums to play

Alexa, play Al Jolson or Play Al Jolson's Greatest Hits I can play a single Al Jolson song by saying

Alexa, play "About a Quarter to Nine" by Al Jolson Alexa, play "Where did Robinson Crusoe Go with Friday"

Alexa, play songs by Dean Martin & Jerry Lewis.

The first song I got from Martin and Lewis this time was a great one – funny too.

Funny, Funny, Funny, What Money Can DO! Try it. you'll like it.

I like oldies So, if I want a random mix, I might ask for an Amazon playlist such as

Alexa play Amazon Oldies. First song tonight was Ringo Star *It don't come easy*.

If I want to hear Beatles songs, I would say

Alexa, play the Beatles

If I wanted to hear the song, Please Please Me by the Beatles, I might say

Alexa, play Please Please Me

If I would like to play a particular Beatles Album with the same name as a single, to get the album instead of the single, I would say

Alexa, play the Beatles Album Please Please Me!

I can get Peter Paul and Mary tunes by saying

Alexa, play Peter Paul & Mary

Then Alexa would play something like If you miss the train I'm on

or

Leaving on a Jet Plane

I think you get the point. Which leads me to playing Crosby Stills & Nash.

Alexa, play Crosby Stills & Nash.

Obediently this time after the "shuffle," the trio played "It's getting to the point.."

Now that you got the point, we can move to our next chapter and talk about some other musical capabilities.

OK???

Chapter 7 Here Are Some Alexa Music Commands, etc.



Here are a few Alexa music commands that you should simply try to exercise your skills. Go get'em!

Alexa, play music Alexa, play country music Alexa, turn up the volume Alexa, turn up the bass Alexa, set the treble to three Alexa, reset the equalizer Alexa, play hip hop Alexa, pause Alexa, resume Alexa, skip Alexa, next Alexa, set the bass to four

Here are a few others:

To ask for help: "Alexa, help."

To have a conversation: "Alexa, let's chat."

To mute or unmute sound: "Alexa, mute" or, "Alexa, unmute."

To stop or pause: "Alexa, stop" or, "Alexa, shut up." To change the volume: "Alexa, set the volume to 5," "Alexa, louder" or "Alexa, turn up/down the volume."

Control music playback on another Alexa speaker: "Alexa, stop in the kitchen" or "Alexa, next in the office."

Restart song: "Alexa, restart."

"Alexa, wake me up every day at 8 am to music" This allows users to set their mornings off right with music from Pandora, Spotify, TuneIn, iHeartRadio and Vevo.

Set an alarm: "Alexa, set an alarm for 7 a.m." or "Alexa, wake me up at 7 in the morning."

Set a music alarm: "Alexa, wake me up to [artist, song, genre, playlist or album] at 8 a.m.,"

Set a repeating alarm: "Alexa, set a repeating alarm for weekdays at 7 a.m."

Create a named timer: "Alexa, set a pizza timer for 20 minutes."

Set multiple timers: "Alexa, set a second timer for 5 minutes."

Check timer status: "Alexa, how much time is left on the pizza timer?" or "Alexa, what are my timers?"

Cancel a timer: "Alexa, cancel the pizza timer" or

"Alexa, cancel the 15-minute timer."

Ask the time: "Alexa, what time is it?"

Ask the date: "Alexa, what's the date?"

Ask when the next alarm is: "*Alexa, when's my next alarm?*" Cancel an alarm: "Alexa, cancel my alarm for 2 p.m."

Snooze alarm: "Alexa, snooze."

Check dates: "Alexa, when is [holiday] this year?"

Changing the Volume

Besides playing particular artists or albums or an individual song for you Alexa can be asked to adjust the volume while a tune or a song is playing. In fact, there are several ways to control the volume of your Amazon Echo speaker.

Not only can you control the volume by using the volume control on the device itself (Not an echo), but you can adjust the volume using Alexa voice commands.

You can use the Alexa app on your phone also but that would be too much work in my opinion. Whatever method you choose. They all do the same thing. So use whichever method is most convenient

Often, the easiest way to control the volume of your Alexa speaker is to simply tell it how loud it should be. How do you do that?

Picture a dial from zero to ten. You can tell Alexa to change its volume anywhere from zero to 10, where zero means no sound (mute). For example, you can say, "Alexa, set the volume to 5," which is the device's 50 percent volume level.

Than you are not guessing. You can also ask Alexa about the volume:

"Alexa what is the volume?

You can control incrementally by saying things like "Alexa, increase the volume by 2" or

"Alexa, increase the volume by 30 percent."

As noted, if you're not sure what the current volume is, you can say, "Alexa, what's the current volume?"

You can also use your Echo's speaker volume buttons

Yes, you may not see them at first, but every Amazon Echo device has physical volume controls.

Most devices have plus and minus buttons to set volume. Some Echo speakers use a dial instead — spin the dial at the top of the device to adjust the volume. For example, on the Dot on the next page, you can see the + and – buttons.



How to create a playlist for Alexa

Creating the playlist is very simple, all you need to do is say, "Alexa, create a new playlist." She will confirm and ask you what to name the playlist. You need to say the title out loud, and once the playlist is created, you can start adding songs to it.

Call the playlist Briansplaylist.

Then you can say Add Mr. Bojangles to Briansplaylist

Do this after you have been playing with your brand new Alexa for about week. By then, you will know what songs or what albums you want in your playlist
